Growth Group Worship Series

September 22-October 27, 2019

Have you participated in an online challenge? There was the “ALS Ice Bucket Challenge” a few years ago that many participated in. Then there was the bottle flipping challenge. Other fun challenges include the “Try Not to Laugh Challenge,” “The Whisper Challenge” and “The Mannequin Challenge.” There have also been some very unhealthy and dangerous challenges that have been rightly warned against. The point in all of these online challenges is to participate and then share with others your success or failure.

You are invited to participate this fall in an off-line challenge, a real world challenge. The point of this challenge is not to gather likes and views online, but rather to grow as a disciple of Jesus.

The “Red Letter Challenge” focuses on the “red letters” of the Bible. In many Bibles, the words of Jesus in the gospels are printed in red. This is done to highlight them and draw attention to the importance of the words of our Lord.

This 40 day challenge will call us to actually put into practice the red letters of Jesus. To go beyond merely listening and thinking and agreeing with what He says. Not merely to hear, but to do. For this is what it means to be a disciple. Disciples do not just listen to Jesus or read His words. They follow Jesus, putting his teachings into practice each day.

There are three parts to the Red Letter Challenge series

- Sunday Worship (September 22 – October 27)
 - Red Letter Challenge Devotion Book
 - Red Letter Challenge Growth Group

Red Letter Challenge Books

This small group worship series is based on the Discipleship Devotion book “The Red Letter Challenge” by Pastor Zach Zehnder. This book contains the challenges for each day as we go through this growth series together. We will have copies available for you before the end of August. Our goal is have one of these books in the hands of all who worship at St. John’s. Our cost for each book is \$15, but we will make them available to anyone. We are only asking a suggested donation of \$5. We truly want each person to have one of these books. Watch for more information regarding when the books will be available.

Red Letter Challenge Growth Groups

We are also inviting all to become part of a growth group (small group) for this series, similar to what we did last fall for the “I Am” series. This will provide an opportunity to grow in fellowship, grow in discipleship, as well as providing encouragement as we work through the challenges. - **T**urn on the DVD/Video player and facilitate discussion with provided questions based on the video teachings

FOUNDATIONS: BASIC CHRISTIAN TEACHINGS

New Stephen Minister Training Class To Begin In September

Caring ministry at St. John's will be expanding soon as we prepare to train the next group of Stephen Ministers. We currently have 7 Stephen Ministers and more are needed. Training will be done in two 10 week segments from September 19 to November 21 and January 9 to March 12. Those completing training will be commissioned as Stephen Ministers to provide one-to-one care to individuals experiencing difficulties in life.



Stephen Ministry training combines sound theological principles with contemporary psychology. The skills our Stephen Ministers learn and practice prepare them to provide a very high level of Christian caregiving. The training is intense because it explores some serious life issues, but it is also a growth-producing and enjoyable experience.

The 50 hours of Stephen Ministry training is broken down into twenty 2 ½ - hour sessions that will be held on Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 9:00 PM. Among the training topics are:

- Feelings: Yours, Mine, and Ours
- The Art of Listening
- Distinctively Christian Caring
- Assertiveness: Relating Gently and Firmly
- Maintaining Boundaries in Caregiving
- Confidentiality
- Ministering to Those Experiencing Grief
- Caring for People before, during, and after Hospitalization

Stephen Minister training not only provides knowledge about caregiving, but also gives the opportunity for personal and spiritual growth. A close Christian community will form among the trainees by the end of the classes.


Actual Offering Income for Jun:

Putting God’s Words into Practice


CREW 34 was a huge hit last school year and we are excited to bring it back! We will kick it off in September. Stay tuned for more information on that.







History of 'The Lutheran Hour

On October 2, 1930, the first broadcast of **The Lutheran Hour®** radio program was aired, with Dr. Walter A. Maier as speaker. The Lutheran Laymen's League, which had formed thirteen years earlier as a financial support organization for the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, had a vision of spreading the Gospel message using the young technology of broadcast radio. Since that time, the call of Christ has been carried around the world by radio waves to share the Good News.

The Lutheran Hour airs on nearly 1,800 stations throughout North America and reaches more than one million listeners each week. The Lutheran Hour, can be heard locally on KCBC, AM 770, at 7:30 pm on Saturday, 7:30 am and 4:30 pm on Sunday or 3:00 am on Monday. It is also available KAWZ, FM 88.1 at 7:00 am on Sunday or on the internet anytime at www.lutheranhour.org.

After a slow start this spring due to cooler weather and late rains, the crops in the Mission Farm are in increasing production, especially the peppers, the green beans, the summer squash, the tomatoes, peaches, plums. Soon we will add to that the corn and apples! This means not only more helping hands are needed for picking crops, but also for prepping crops to send in to the Food Bank: washing, trimming, boxing, weighing, etc. Work sessions are each Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday mornings, 8:30 – 11:30 a.m. Bring work gloves and shoes and a wide brimmed hat. For some crops a long sleeved shirt is helpful. We provide the water, instructions, and pleasant company. If you can't stay the full time, or can help out only one day a week, that's fine. Remember: "Many hands mean light work!"

Disability Ministry: Feeling Comfortable With People Who Have Disabilities



Do you have a loved one with dementia or Alzheimer's? Here are a few good things to know when communicating with them. (CereScan.com/Conditions/Alzheimer's)

1. Agree, never argue.
2. Divert, never reason.
3. Distract, never shame.
4. Reassure, never lecture.
5. Reminisce, never say "Remember."
6. Repeat, never say "I told you".
7. Do what they can do, never say "You can't."
8. Ask, never demand.
9. Encourage, never condescend.
10. Reinforce, never force.

Actually these practices are helpful in all relationships. However, they become very critical when some form of dementia is present in the life of your loved one.




