February 18, 2020


You are invited to take part in discussing and planning the future ministry of St. John's. As mentioned in the January Vine, we are seeking input as we develop the ministry plan for fiscal year 2020-2021, and beyond.

There will be an open forum on **Tuesday, February 18, 2020 from 6:00 - 8:00 pm**. Child care will be provided. The purpose of this survey is to gather input for the ministry plan and to discuss ministry priorities. We will be looking at responses to the input survey. We will also be considering the results of an analysis of our congregation's health conducted by lay and staff leaders of our congregation.

The ideas generated and discussed at this forum will be studied by lay and staff leaders and crafted into a draft ministry plan, which will be further refined at another congregation open forum (date to be determined).

# The Challenge and the Cross

Last fall we were all invited to participate in the Red Letter Challenge. For forty day, in worship, in small groups and in daily devotions, we focused on Jesus' call to discipleship. We sought to grow in following Jesus as we looked at these five aspects of discipleship:

- Being Our discipleship begins with and is empowered by spending time with Jesus. We do this through worship, by being in the Word, having an active prayer life, as well as in other ways.
- **Forgiving** Our life with Christ rests on His gift of forgiveness by grace through the cross. We seek to grow in living this grace by forgiving others.
- **Serving** Jesus came to serve. The cross is the central and most extreme way that Jesus lived His servanthood. As followers seeking to imitate Him, we seek to serve others.
- Giving Jesus came to give. He came to give himself completely for us and for all the world in order to give us forgiveness, salvation and resurrection. As followers seeking to imitate Him in living His grace, we seek to grow in generosity.
- Going Jesus came for all the world and so He concluded his earthly mission by sending His followers to make disciples of all the nations. We seek to follow this mandate today in sharing the love of Jesus with others.

This Lent, we are invited to go on the 40 day journey once again. Although we will be reading the same devotions and pursuing the same challenges, our Sunday worship will take a different direction, a Lent direction. Discipleship is all about following and imitating Jesus. So we will focus on Jesus as He approaches the cross and we will see in Him the blessing and challenge of the five targets outlined above.

# By His Wounds We Are Healed

The innocent Son of God had no sins of His own for which He deserved to die, yet His enemies falsely accused Him of violating every commandment of God. In each service in this series we will see that it was our sin, our disobedience, that Jesus bore in His body on the cross. The Lord laid on Him "the iniquity of us all." Jesus suffered the penalty of death in our place, and "by His wounds we are healed."

All the services will be on Wednesdays at 7:00 pm. There will be a soup supper before each service at 6:00 in the parish hall.

#### Ash Wednesday (February 26) The Wounds of Blasphemy

In this service, we remember that the wounds of blasphemy we committed against our Lord were laid on Christ on the cross. Ash Wednesday reminds us that though we have been brought low by sin, our Lord will bless us with new life in him through the cross. *NOTE:* There will also be a service at 1:00 PM on Ash Wednesday

#### Wednesday, March 4 A Service for Health and Health

The Lent service for this week will be a "Health and Healing" service. This service will focus on the power of God's Word to bring healing in the midst of physical ailments, strained relationships, and other difficulties and challenges in life. # Mision de Jesus

Our Spanish language ministry, Mision de Jesus, continues to honor Jesus and reach out to the Napa Community, under the leadership of Deacon Francisco Hurtado. The congregation meets at 2790 Kilburn Avenue.

Worship is on Sundays at 10:00 and is entirely in Spanish. Sunday school for children is offered at the same time. There is a prayer gathering at the church on Wednesday evenings and a Bible Study on Friday evenings.

Deacon Hurtado was recently re-authorized by the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod Council of Presidents as a Licensed Lay Deacon. This means that he has the blessing of our church body to regularly preach the Word and administer the sacraments, even though he is not ordained. In Deacon Hurtado regularly meets with Rev. Greg Klotz to deepen his knowledge of biblical theology. Rev Klotz, currently serving Grace Lutheran Church in Pittsburg, CA, has spent most of his ministry in Central and South America, training local missionaries and pastors. We are delighted that through Linc Bay Area, Pastor Klotz is bringing his ministry training expertise to our Napa Community.


# **Mission India Trip**

As my ministry continues to grow, it's always interesting to see the ways God connects me (and my team) with other people. While most of the people I meet are right here in the Napa Valley, sometimes I wind up meeting people from far away. Last month I met a gentleman from Hawaii who had traveled to the Bay Area for medical treatment. He reached out to my team and I was able to visit with him and his wife while he recuperated in San Francisco.



Later in the month, I spent some time in the classroom with a young girl whose father had recently died. A family friend was familiar with my work through Chaplain Lee Shaw and the Napa Police Department and asked us to visit her. I feel very blessed to have been able to spend some time with her and her classmates during such a difficult time. When their teacher asked them how they felt at the end of my visit, many of them said they felt relaxed and comfortable and better than they had before I arrived. That made me smile! We were also called to comfort after the unexpected death of 2 students in our local schools.

Sometimes I make connections with people when I'm out in the community and not on an "official" visit. The other day I met two wonderful women having lunch at a coffee shop. They were on a break from work at the Napa State Hospital and were so excited to see "Please Pet Me" on my vest. They told me that they it had been a tough morning and that seeing me made their day.

I am so grateful for all the opportunities God provides to connect me with those who are in need of comforting and the love of Christ. During this Lenten season, as we turn our focus to Christ and all He has done for us, I look forward to the new connections He has in store for me where I can share His love with others.


Actual Offering Income for Dec:

## Faith Empowers God's Stewards

The writer of Hebrews defines faith: "Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see" (Hebrews 11:1). Faith enables us to be God-pleasing stewards. "And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to

Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him" (Hebrews 11:6). The eleventh chapter of Hebrews is known as the "Faith Chapter." From Abel down through the ages, the writer names the heroes of faith, listing their accomplishments, preceding each one with "by faith."

Through faith, we understand that our stewardship is God working in and through us. It is not what we do, not what we give, not how we serve – but what God does, what God gives, how God serves, and our response to His love and gifts to us. God has shown us His plan for our lives. "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). This is the definition of stewardship: doing the good works which God has prepared for us to do. God empowers and equips us to be faithful stewards. God has chosen us to carry out His work on earth. "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit—fruit that will last" (John 15:16).

It is through faith that our pastors confidently preach the Word of the Lord. It is God's message, God's gift, and he is only the channel through which it flows. Through faith, the servant humbly steps forward to serve. His only motive is that God may receive the glory as he offers his hands, feet, lips, his whole body, soul, and mind in service. Through faith, the teacher diligently prepares her lessons, seeking the leading of the Holy Spirit, studying the Word of God, and looking into the hearts of her students. God creates the learning; His Spirit creates the faith. As stewards, we are the faithful vessels that God uses. Through faith, God can make us into His faithful stewards.

**Prayer:** Lord, You are the creator and source of all good things. I thank You for the privilege and opportunity that You give me to be a steward of Your creation. I thank You for the faith that You give me which enables me to carry out Your will. I thank You for Your love and grace. Help me to be a faithful steward in telling others of Jesus' love. I pray that You will continue to work in me so that I can be the steward that You created me to be. In the name of Christ I pray. Amen.

# Disability Ministry: Feeling Comfortable With People Who Have Disabilities

It is important to remember that in the context of the Americans with Disability Act (ADA), "disability" is a legal term rather than a medical one. Because it has a legal definition, the ADA's definition is different from how disability is defined under other laws.

The ADA defines a person with a disability as <u>a person who has a physical or mental impairment</u> that substantially limits one or more major life activity. This includes people who have a record of such an impairment, even if they do not currently have a disability.

While there is not enough space to define all physical or mental disabilities, the following is a link to the Specialized Ministries Information Sheets from the LCMS web site <a href="http://lcms.org/socialissues.disability">http://lcms.org/socialissues.disability</a>. It includes information about people who are blind, deaf, or having mobility disabilities, mental illness, or developmental disabilities.

The concern of the Church for those with disabilities needs to be how does their particular disability significantly impact their participation with us in worship, fellowship, Christian growth, and service? And what can be done to free them up to feel welcomed and fully participate in normal congregational activities? Here's where we have to employ "empathy" rather than mere "sympathy". We need to try to understand their situation and feelings, not just feel sorry for them. With empathy we can better find ways to empower their full participation.

Moreover, while persons with a particular "disability" may be limited in what they can do in some life activities, it does not mean that they have no "abilities". They have abilities to minister to others, and are not limited to only receiving ministry.

#### So what's new at the Farm?

Attention, please! It is time to announce the total amount of fresh fruits and vegetables raised on the Mission Farm and submitted to the Napa County Food Bank to help feed financially stressed people. Drum roll, please: tat-a-t

tat. We are pleased to announce that the Mission Farm Team has raised and contributed during the year 2019 the total of 12,166 lbs. -- or, if you prefer, 6.083 tons of produce! The Lord is good!

We've reached a quiet time on the Farm. Nearly all the crops are in, including some of the cool weather crops: broccoli, broccolini, Brussel sprouts, and carrots. Now we are allowing (and encouraging) the Rain Master to send refreshing rains while the volunteers rest and heal from any wear and tear experienced during the busy season. There are still certain activities that need to take place: pruning the trees (thanks Ron and Brian), spreading wood chips on the road ways (thanks Dick), weeding (whenever we can find a relatively dry time), seeding cover crop (thank you team), and planning for the next crop year.

We've added another implement for the Big Orange Dream Machine (otherwise known as Mr. Kubota) – a plow that will allow us to turn the soil over to the depth of 12". That will make for healthier soil, and hence, better crop returns.

What we would also like to add are more volunteers to join us. Mr. Kubota has taken a lot of the back-breaking work out of the equation. No previous gardening or farming experience is required (although helpful). We can teach you what needs to be done and how to do it. We are generally on the site of Monday, Wednesday and Saturday mornings.

If you can't give that much time to the project, come when you can. Or volunteer for our "On Call" list when we have need for a lot of volunteers during planting or harvest times. For more information, call me, Ted Zimmerman (294-2033) or Ron Johnson (299-9517).


