Jesus Christ: The Same Yesterday and Today and Forever

In these uncertain times, when everything seems to be changing, we take comfort in the unchanging love of our Savior, Jesus Christ. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever (Hebrews 13:8)." His love, His presence, His promises, and His grace are the solid foundation when so many other things are changing and unsure.

Jesus is unchanging, but our ministry is not. Our ministry has moved almost completely to online or telephone. Our school ministry is completely online, and worship services are online as well. Our buildings are essentially closed, except for some staff working alone. For this reason, activities that require people coming together in person, such as Large Print Ministry, and Bible Studies, have been suspended for the time being.

The church office is closed, but Christy will still be receiving phone calls and emails to the church office. We will also be checking the mail.

Mission Farm

There is an exception to everything on campus shutting down: The Mission Farm. The core Mission Farm team is still working on the farm, while practicing safe social distancing. The food that our farm provides to the Food Bank is very important to our Napa community and I am thankful to God for this dedicated team continuing its work. In the interest of safety and abiding with the shelter at home guidelines, we are not asking for additional volunteers for the Mission Farm at this time.

Communication

The primary way in which we are communicating is the E-vine. If you are not familiar with it, the E-vine is an email from our church with news and other information regarding upcoming ministry. In order to subscribe to the E-vine, please go to the church's website (www.stjohnslutheran.net) and scroll to the bottom of the page where you will find the sign-up for the E-vine and the daily Abide devotion. Past e-vines are on the website. Go to the "news" tab and click on "recent e-vines."

All of our worship services are Live Stream Home-based. We are having one service on Sunday mornings at 9:30 AM. We have one more Wednesday Lent Service on Wednesday, April 1 at 7:00 PM. The Holy Week schedule is posted on the church website.

If online communication and streaming worship are not options for you, please let us know. We will seek to keep you connected in other ways. We have had people join in our streaming worship by telephone and we are able to send out print versions of the e-vine updates.

Stephen Ministry – A Ministry of Listening

Think of a time when you really felt cared for. Chances are someone focused on what you had to say and was attentive to your needs. He or she listened to how you felt instead of telling you how you should feel or what you should do.



Jesus was the model of a good listener. He demonstrated how much He really cared about people by listening. The woman at the well, Nicodemus, or the disciples on the road to Emmaus are just a few examples of Jesus caring by first listening to people.

Listening is one of the most powerful ways that we care for each other. In Stephen Ministry training, a great deal of time is spent teaching and practicing listening skills. You too can become a more caring listener by understanding and applying these six listening concepts:

- 1. Listening is active. It takes energy and commitment to listen really well. Focus your attention on what the other person has to say instead of thinking of what you'll say next. Look at him or her while you listen, and nod along from time to time so the person knows you're tuned in.
- **2. Listening takes patience.** Often you need to build trust before someone will open up to you. Constant, patient listening is a key.
- **3.** Listening involves more than just words. Pay attention not only to what is *said*, but to what is *not said* or to what is said with a smile or a sigh. Pay attention to body language. Does it agree with or contradict a person's spoken words?
- **4. Good listeners aren't completely silent.** Restate key thoughts or ideas to be sure you understood correctly, or ask focused questions to encourage the person to reach a little deeper.
- 5. Listening happens over time. One conversation might build upon an earlier one. As you listen over several conversations, are there any recurring themes or patterns in what the person has said? Are there any contradictions from what was said earlier? These are signs there may be more to explore underneath.
- 6. **Listening is confidential.** A great way to build that trust and to show the person you really care for him or her is to maintain confidentiality and not to share with others what was told to you in private conversation.

We all want St. John's to be a caring place, where everyone truly feels cared for. Reach out to someone today and listen to how they're doing. Just as our Stephen Ministers use good listening skills to communicate how much they care, you can too. Follow and practice these listening principles and make a concentrated effort toward becoming a better listener. Listening is a great gift to share.




New mobile phone application makes supporting ministry even more convenient.

NEW SOUTH CAMPUS FENCING

You have probably noticed the new rod iron fencing going in between the Sanctuary and the Parish Hall as well as the breezeway by the church office. As we announced in the fall, this fencing is part of our Campus Security Plan (approved by the Board of Directors and discussed at a congregational open forum in October).



This plan has included a number of other security measures intended to keep our students and staff a little safer. Once complete, gates by the bell tower and the breezeway will be keyed to the master church/school key. So, if you can get into the church, parish hall, or classrooms, the same key will work on these gates. At this time, the area between the school and church offices will still be open for access to the campus at all times. Please remember to sign in at the church or school office while on campus during the school day (8:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.).



Disability Ministry: Feeling Comfortable With People Who Have Disabilities

It was a joy for me to be able to share my daughter Stacie's story at the recent St. John's Women's Tea. My prayer is that hearing of God's faithfulness in caring for Stacie and all of our family throughout the years will be an encouragement to you in your walk with the Lord. We all recognize that for Stacie there is only one main focus in life, and that is JESUS. Allow me to share one more event with you that underscores this truth!

Stacie has a rare form of epilepsy called Lennox-Gastaut Syndrome, as well as intellectual and developmental disabilities. With these challenges and heavy medications, she lost her ability to speak from the time she was 4 years old until God restored her speech at the age of 21. Learning how to communicate and experience independence and relationships with others was challenging!

When she was 24 years old, her health had improved enough that she was able to move from our home to Good Shepherd Lutheran Home (now known as Bethesda Lutheran Communities) in Fremont, CA. Over the next years she had a lot to learn with the help of dedicated staff and housemates. She loved living there, yet there were times of great frustration. She went through a period of several months when she tried solving any frustration by expressing rage and anger toward others. It finally reached a point where Ted and I, as parents and conservators, were asked to attend a meeting of the Program Manager, Area Director, Regional Center Case Manager, and the Spiritual Director for the home. Things were very serious, and we expected that Stacie would lose her placement at the home. We understood the situation and knew they were making a decision for the good of the other eleven residents and the staff who were responsible for the wellbeing of all under their care.

The meeting took place as scheduled. Each person presented the issues and events which had led to this meeting. Stacie, Ted, and I listened intently to all that was being reviewed. It was a heavy story, filled with negatives. When all had given their reports, the Spiritual Director, looked with love at Stacie. She said, "Stacie, these are hard things to listen to. Is there anything that you want to say?"

Stacie sat up straight, give a big smile, and said: "I have GOOD NEWS for you! 'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.' Isn't that GOOD NEWS!" Her smile radiated love to everyone there.

We were all stunned! Stacie's message struck our hearts! Everything came into focus with the fact that we ALL have our weaknesses and faults, we ALL stand in need of God's forgiveness, yet God does not see us as hopeless cases! We are ALL dearly beloved and his promises are for us ALL.

The Director simply announced, "I think this meeting is over!" And it was. There was no other message to be given. We had focused on negatives. Stacie showed us GOD'S GRACE that covers it all! She also has continued to live with joy and success at Bethesda now for 24 years!

I hope that we recognize, without a doubt, that the Holy Spirit is not bound by what we may perceive as a disability in understanding. The power of God's word and his truth is unlimited, and is for all people. People with disabilities are often the ones who most clearly reveal to us God's love and grace.

OFFERING UPDATE


Actual Offering Income for Feb:

Meditation:

"One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much...No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money." (Luke 16:10 and 13) (ESV)

Faithful in All Things

Jesus is saying that a faithful person will handle God's gifts faithfully regardless of whether he has few or many gifts entrusted to him. What we do with what we have shows our faithfulness.

A faithful person will do the small things well. One day a young man went to a bank to apply for a job. After his interview, he was leaving the bank and happened to notice some trash on the floor. He picked it up and put it in the waste paper basket. Seconds later, he helped an elderly lady with the

door. Unknown to the young man, the man who had interviewed him for the job was observing him. The young man was promptly summoned back and given the job. The employer's comment: "Anyone who pays attention to the small things as you just did needs to work here."

Unfortunately, we Christians may incorrectly think that small things aren't important to God. We may have the attitude that God isn't concerned with the small amount of money or other gifts that we have been given. In the Bible, God spoke mightily through the little that people had. God used the widow and her two mites to teach us a lesson about sacrificial giving. He used the small amount of flour and oil that the widow of Zarephath had to demonstrate obedience. Jesus used the loaves and fish of a young boy to reveal how God can magnify a small gift. God commends our faithfulness with small things, and He doesn't overlook what faithful people do with small things.

Through God's Word, we understand that small things do count. Because we understand our need to be faithful with all things, we should ask ourselves how we are handling the seemingly small things in our lives. Are we handling small things well in our homes, jobs, and churches? Can non-Christians see a difference in us? With God's help, we can be faithful with ALL that we've been given. Through our faithfulness, God will be glorified.

Prayer: Lord, I am a sinful person who continually thinks bad thoughts and makes poor decisions. I am in need of forgiveness so I plead with repentant heart for Your mercy. You give me so much for which I give You praise and thanks. Please grant me the faith that I need to be faithful with the small things so You can trust me with more things. Help me to live a life that gives You honor and glory. In Christ's name I pray. Amen.

So what's new at the Farm?

As I write this article, the orchards are dressed in a beautiful array of colors—light pink, dark pink, white blossoms, and of course, new leaves in fresh spring green. While much of the blossoming will be complete by the time you read this article, the apple trees will be putting on their displays. Ron Johnson and Brian O'Neil had given the trees a nice haircut during the dormant season, and the orchard looks uniform in height. Of

course, this wasn't done for appearance sake, but rather to improve the ease (and safety) of harvest. We did have to replace about ten of our trees. We had lost nearly all the pear trees and a number of our plums due to blight. We replaced them with apricots and pluots. We certainly hope that the bees have been busy. The rains held off during the full blossom, so we should have a good harvest this year.

Dick Lemin has been very busy with Mr. Kubota, getting the soil ready for planting. We added a bigger plow so we can create a deeper level of top soil with a balanced amount of soil and organic material. This is important with our heavy clay soils. Of course, that will also keep Lois Johnson happy . . . more rocks for her rock collections. The gophers may not be happy, however. Again, as you read this article, we should in short order be planting seeds and seedlings. This is the fun part. It may be time to come out and try your hand at it. You won't even have to get your hands dirty—at least if you wear gloves. Warning: gardening can be addictive! It may keep calling you back each Monday, Wednesday and Saturday mornings.



Scrip: What is Scrip? Scrip is simply gift cards. Our school sells gift cards from many vendors as a quick and easy fundraiser. Cards are bought at a discount and sold at face value. The difference goes to our A.P.T. (Association of Parents and Teachers). 
