Disability Ministry: Feeling Comfortable With People Who Have Disabilities

No, I have not confused my Disability Ministry article for my Mission Farm article, though it may appear so at the beginning.

On the Mission Farm we recently put a sunshade over the bee hive in the orchard to keep the hive from becoming overheated, putting the bees at risk. It was a simple pop-up sunshade like someone might set up when going on a picnic or camping. We meant well.

The bee keeper told us that we would need to move the sunshade back a few feet. We had positioned it so that the entrance to the hive would be shaded. What we didn't understand is that bees when they fly from the hive need to make a nearly vertical ascent. Our placement meant that the bees had to fly through the wires of the fence, and that was upsetting them. How do they know? The Bee Keeper knows! The Farm workers meant well, but lacking understanding did not do well!

So it is in dealing with many relationship issues. Problems are sometimes unwittingly created by not understanding what the other person needs for his sense of well-being. Once that is clarified, the two can more easily find a way to resolve the problem in a mutually acceptable way.

So it is in dealing with people with disabilities. During the days of the corona virus threat, we have been encouraged by the CDC and our state and local health departments to wear a covering over our nose and mouth. That is meant for everyone's safety. However, we have come to discover that it puts many people with hearing impairments at a disadvantage. Many of them have learned to read lips. That's a bit of a challenge when those wishing to speak to them have their lips covered. It's as impossible to facilitate communication as it would be for me to try to communicate with you through this article by typing it with boxing gloves on both hands. No way!

I don't know what the answer is to that particular problem. I do know that building relationships with people with disabilities requires us to seek to understand what special needs people with disabilities need, and what their preferences are.

Another example. As a person with increasing loss of hearing, I need people to speak, not loudly, but directly to me, and slowly, being careful to enunciate. I hear vowels, but often cannot distinguish the consonants. I may respond to you in terms of what I thought I heard . . . and then watch your confused expressions. Just saying!


Because of the challenges of building relationships with people with disabilities, we sometimes decide not to bother. But we all need relationships. Certainly this period of "social distancing" we have been through has taught us that. People with disabilities need "super-sensitive" people to be their friends!

Faith that Pleases God

The first gifts that we read about in Scripture are the offerings made by Cain and Abel who were the sons of Adam and Eve. In Genesis 4:2-4 we read, "...Now Abel kept flocks and Cain worked the soil. In the course of time Cain brought some of the fruits of the soil as an offering to the Lord. But Abel brought fat portions from some of the firstborn of his

flock." Cain and Abel brought offerings or gifts for the Lord. Because one worked the land and the other raised animals, their gifts were different. We read that Cain "brought some of the fruits of the soil as an offering," whereas Abel "brought fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock."

Between the two brothers there is also an indication of a difference in the attitudes of their hearts. While Cain wasn't concerned about giving the first or best of his crop, Abel gave the firstborn of his flock. God looked with favor upon Abel's offering. God looked into the hearts of both Cain and Abel as He looks into our hearts. He saw Abel's humble faith. By his gift, Abel showed his sincere gratitude for all that God had done for Him.

We need to understand that it's not the size of our gifts and offerings which makes them acceptable to the Lord, but rather it is the attitude of our hearts and minds toward God. God wants our gifts to be an expression of our love for Him. He wants us to give cheerfully rather than grudgingly. He wants us to give out love through faith. We are told by the writer of Hebrews that without faith it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6).

May this story of giving by Cain and Abel help us to examine our attitude toward giving. If we are not giving our first and best out of faith and love to the Lord, God does not look with favor upon our giving. May God grant us all faithful, loving, and giving hearts.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for giving me the ability and desire to give to You. Grant me strength to give my first and best to You. May I always use my life and resources to give You honor and glory. Use me as Your instrument of love. In Christ's name I pray. Amen.






WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY
