The June poundage of fresh, organically grown fruit and vegetables turned in the Napa Food Bank by St. John's Mission Farm is 1034 lbs. Poundage for year to date is 1794 lbs. With fruit starting to be harvested, and row crops maturing, the poundage will grow exponentially each month. God is good!

At the same time, the number of families that the Food Bank is serving has exploded from about 160 families to more than 2000! God multiply the harvest!




OFFERING UPDATE

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)(ESV)

The Father's Great Love

Those days between Good Friday and Easter Sunday had to have been long, dreary, hopeless days for Jesus' followers. Sometimes we go through days like that: someone we love is battling a terminal illness; we don't get the promotion we had been promised; the kids are rebelling and having trouble at school; we don't think anyone understands what we're going through.

Never, though, are we beyond hope, for those days between Good Friday and Easter Sunday have passed. We know that the victory has been won. We know our troubles are but "light and momentary" (2 Corinthians 4:17).

When we focus on God through His Word, we get a different perspective. For example, meditate on these words from 1 John 3:1: "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!" Examine the word "lavish." Without limit, God has given His love; He gave His Son to show us the depth of His love and to take away the wall that we built between Him and us with our sin. And now He calls us His children! He doesn't just call us children—He has made us His children!

Easter brings us another promise—that, just as Christ has been resurrected from the dead, we, too, will be raised to spend eternity in His presence. And there "we shall be like Him" (1 John 3:2). In the meantime, let us keep focusing on Christ and use the gifts our Father has given us in order that more souls might join with us before His throne of grace.

Prayer: Lord, please open my eyes and heart so I can better see Your love at work in my life. Help me to understand that I exist only out of Your love and grace. Help me, Lord, to live a life worthy of Your love. Keep m resolute and firm in my love for You. In Your precious name I pray. Amen.

Scrip, simply put, is gift cards that you use to purchase many items you would normally buy with cash. By buying Scrip first, St. John's Lutheran School will receive a percentage from each vendor. Percentage varies with each yendor.

Many businesses are temporarily closed, so it's hard to know where you can get the things you need. You can still buy all your household essentials, and help support SJLS with gift cards to: WalMart, Target, Safeway, Lucky's, Nob Hill/Raley's, Shell, Chevron, Arco, CVS, Staples, Amazon.com and Visa.

Now is a great time to introduce yourself to Scrip (gift cards) if you are unfamiliar with how our program works. It benefits you and SJLS all at the same time. Once you start using Scrip you will see how easy and convenient it is. If you are a family who budgets their monthly expenses, Scrip is a great tool to use. In late June, I got my first real chance to hone my skills in public, spending a little time hanging out near a local coffee shop. My team and I continue to observe safe practices and social distancing when we are in public. While we were out, we made several new friends. It was such a blessing to be able to share our ministry with them.



Early this month, Micah Comfort Dog and I accompanied Reuben Comfort Dog on a visit to the Shasta County Coroner's Office, following a shooting in Red Bluff. We feel very honored to have been able to bring comfort to those whose job is never easy, but particularly difficult in these unsettled times. We are truly blessed to be a blessing.

Although we are not going inside care facilities at this time, the staff and residents of Brookdale Senior Living and Piner's Nursing Home recently invited me to stop by and do a "window" visit with them. During the visit, my handler and ministry partner and I come to a resident's window so they can see us and we can visit with them while being socially distanced and separated by glass. 
New mobile phone application makes supporting ministry even more convenient.


