St. John's and the Purple Tier

On November 16, Napa County moved from the orange tier to the purple tier because of the surge in COVID-19 cases in the county.

What does this mean for St. John's?

- **Worship** Worship will be live-stream only. There will be no in-person worship. We are permitted to meet outdoors, but no events are planned at this point.
- <u>School</u> School will continue meeting in our hybrid format.
- Other In-Person Church Gatherings All gatherings will be online only. We are ceasing all other in-person gatherings. This includes choir practice, boy scouts, all youth events, and all other meetings.
- <u>Church Office</u> Staff may be working in the office, but the church office is closed for visits. If you need to drop off or pick up an item, please call ahead to make arrangements.
- **Thanksgiving Food Bank Ingathering** Please drop of your Food Bank donation during church office hours. Leave your donation outside the church office door.

Advent Midweek Worship

Our Wednesday Night Worship will become Advent Midweek worship during Advent. These services will be on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM.

• December 2 - The O Antiphons of Advent For centuries the Church has used the Advent responses knows as the Great O Antiphons, so named because each one beings with an "O" addressing Christ by one of His biblical names.



The familiar hymn "O Come O Come Emmanuel" is based on the O Antiphons. Our midweek service features the O Antiphons and the singing of this hymn.

• December 9 – The ABCs of Christmas

Our annual trip through the alphabet, thinking of the words and phrases that make up the Christmas Story. People can participate in-person or through the chat stream.

• December 16 – Lessons and Carols

A service of Scripture readings and Christmas Carols led by our Sanctuary Choir. This traditional service of the season walks through the story of salvation, culminating in the birth of the Savior.

• December 23 – Christmas Hymn Stories

We will focus on the stories and Scripture behind several familiar Christmas carols and hymns. And we will sing them!


We pray that you and your family find time this Advent season to reflect on Christ's presence in your life and remember that Jesus is the true reason for this season. Merry Christmas!

So, What's New at the Farm?

BREAKING NEWS! CanDo's Napa Valley *Give!Guide* 2020 will launch on Giving Tuesday, December 1. St. John's Mission Farm will be one of 60 non-profit organizations serving the Napa County community participating in this fundraising effort! The *Give!Guide* website



(www.CanDoGiveGuide.org) provides information about the mission of each of these organizations. Further, the website makes it easy to support any or many of these non-profits with supporting gifts, beginning with gifts as little as \$10! Hopefully, our Mission Farm will be one you choose to support. Remember, many \$10 gifts (just like many hands) makes great works possible! Remember the successful March of Dimes campaign to raise funds in the '50s to combat the polio epidemic?

Our Mission Farm surely needs your help at this time. We have expanded the size of our operation in order to turn in more fresh fruits and vegetables to the Napa Valley Food Bank. The Lord blessed our harvest this year so that we could send in more than 20,000 lbs. . . . a record crop total. It was surely needed. The Food Bank distribution center in the town of Napa had been serving about 50 families a week. Because of the economic effects on jobs due to the COVID-19 pandemic, they are now called on to feed more than 300 families a week! The federal government had been providing Food Banks with surplus foods as part of its response to the COVID crisis. However, that is in danger of being sharply curtailed. This makes what we are able to raise and deliver even more important. And the need will not quickly go away, even after we get a handle on this pandemic.



Loving Our Neighbors

In the story of the Good Samaritan found in the tenth chapter of Luke, the Good Samaritan not only helped an injured person, he took him to an inn where he paid for his room and care. The Samaritan sacrificed money, time, and possessions, and risked his own health and safety for the wounded person. He fulfilled the Golden Rule. By putting no limits on how far he was willing to go to help this stranger, the Samaritan

demonstrated the love we should have for our neighbors. He followed Jesus' command to "Go and do likewise." Helping others may mean more than calling 911. We may need to get involved, get our hands dirty, and go the extra mile.

Why don't we become more involved in helping others? One explanation could be that we have become so smug and settled in our material luxury that we are blind to the opportunities to reach out to others. We forget about the thousands and thousands around the country and world who are starving in body and soul. Like the priest and the rabbi who passed by the injured person, we possess the attitude that what is mine is mine and I'm going to keep it.

God will get our attention in many different ways. One day someone observed a wonderful lesson from the little birds hopping around in search of bits of food. Some snowbirds were busy picking up the crumbs that had been thrown out the window. One of the birds apparently had a stiff neck. Because of its injury, it could not stoop over to pick up the crumbs. But the other birds assisted by picking them up and dropping them into his open bill.


God has placed in each of us a heart that can be trained to be unselfish. Through the redeeming sacrifice of our Savior Jesus Christ, Who faithfully gave His own life, we can show love to others. The love of Jesus, strengthened in us by the Holy Spirit through Word and Sacrament, flows through us so we can show love to people around us.

Prayer: Lord, the story of the Good Samaritan gives me a wonderful example of how I can share the love that You have given to me. Stephen Ministry Training – First 5 Weeks Completed!

Kudos to the Stephen Minister Class of 2021 for completing their first 5 weeks of training. This first block of weekly sessions began October 26 and finished November 23. Training will resume in January with the second block of 5 weeks of lessons. We are so grateful to God for inspiring these seven people to train to be Stephen Ministers: C.C. Commander, George Clark, John and Pam Foottit, Missy Loban, Sal Pagano, and Sandra Mehrens.

The first five weeks covered these areas:

"The Person of the Caregiver," -- five foundational characteristics of a caregiver: Compassionate, Trustworthy, Full of Faith, Skilled, and Christ-Centered.

"Feelings: Yours, Mine, and Ours." -- the importance of recognizing and accepting all the feelings that people have. We learned about Grace-based Acceptance, Empathy, Trust, and Unconditional Positive Regard.

"The Art of Listening." -- honing our listening skills and finding out that listening well is extremely helpful and caring, but is also hard work. Active and reflective listening skills were practiced.

"Distinctively Christian Caring" – this section was discussed over 2 weeks. Trainees discovered effective ways of using resources such as prayer and Scripture as tools in caring ministry. Ideas from the book 'Christian Caregiving: A Way of Life' were discussed, such as remembering that God is the Curegiver and is in charge of results.

These seven trainees are already such a blessing to St. John's, and we wish God's blessings upon them. We also appreciate our current Stephen Ministers and all that they do: Clare King, Deidre and Jason Newton, Jeff Mello, Linda Reed, and Roxana Castro. Please keep all of them in your prayers. 
New mobile phone application makes supporting ministry even more convenient.
