New Sunday Worship Series: Paul's Letter to the Colossians

We will begin a new worship series on January 17, focusing on Paul's letter to the Colossians. In this letter Paul addresses the supremacy and sufficiency of Christ in a challenging world, certainly relevant themes for today.

We will cover chapters 1 and 2 of Colossians between January 17 and February 14, the last Sunday before Lent begins. Then we will continue with chapters three and four beginning on April 11, the Sunday after Easter.

Wednesday Night Worship



Wednesday Morning Bible Class Will Study the Book of Jude – Via Zoom

Pastor Mark will begin teaching the book of Jude on January 6. Jude was the half-brother of Jesus and in just 25 verses deeply and clearly expresses the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ alone. The class will be held via Zoom until we

Stephen Ministry Training – Second Block of Training

The second 5-week block of training for the Stephen Minister Class of 2021 takes place on the 5 Mondays in January. Areas covered will be:

"A Process Approach to Caregiving" -- Five key elements of a Process Approach are Presence, Service, Skills, Boundaries, and Trust.

"Assertiveness: Relating Gently & Firmly" -- This topic is covered over two weeks due to its importance. Can Christians be assertive? We learn about the differences in being assertive, aggressive, and passive, and how to have a healthy, assertive relationship with our care receiver.

"Maintaining Boundaries in Caregiving" – The significance of self, the value of well-defined boundaries, the differences between friendship and a Caring Relationship are covered.

"Crisis Theory and Practice" – How can Stephen Ministers help people in crisis? Events that can lead to crisis, the course of crisis, and responses to crisis will be covered.

While my team and I were limited in our ability to visit people physically last year, we also had the opportunity to find new ways to reconnect with people. In addition to window visits and virtual visits, I was able to participate in several drive-by "parades". My humans also used this time to reach out via emails, cards, and phone calls.

For the past few years, through the generosity of team members and the congregation, my team and I have been privileged to share some Christmas cheer with the students and families at the Camille Creek Community School. Last month several of my handlers and I were blessed to continue this tradition of dropping off gifts at the school prior to the winter break. This year we were able to provide each student's family with a Christmas card and a Walmart gift card. Additionally, we presented the staff members with gift cards and a handwritten note, expressing appreciation for all that they do.

Often, I hear my humans say that they are "blessed to be a blessing." Many times when we visit places we wind up leaving blessed ourselves. Our trip to Camille Creek this year was one of those occasions. Last year, over 70% of the families reached out to the school for assistance with food. The staff was very appreciative of our church and its continued commitment to the school. One of the staff members told my handlers that, "people come and go, but you have always been there." They were very grateful to be remembered and awestruck by our generosity. My handlers were moved by the "blessing that comes with the 5+ years of Aaron's gentle presence" in this special place. 

So, What's New at the Farm?

God gave us a bountiful harvest in 2020 to turn into the Food Bank . . . in excess of 20,000 lbs. This is an increase of approximately 33% over any previous record! Talk about timely, what with the increase of the numbers of families facing food insecurity on account of the impact of COVID. To God be



the glory! We can plan, plant, water, fertilize, and weed the best we know how . . . but only God can give the growth!

Just as the volunteers could not have accomplished this feat without the blessing of God, neither could we have accomplished it without the help of others beyond our usual crew. We had some welcomed additions of volunteers from the community this year who were eager to join us in our mission. They brought experience, cheerful spirits, some valuable community contacts, and in one case, a husband with a larger tractor and willingness to employ it in our service on a "need" basis. That was especially helpful this spring when late rains put a rush on prepping the soil for planting.


Then a group of young 20-30 year-olds joined us . . . members of the Napa County Farm Bureau's "Young Farmers and Ranchers" organization. They joined us most Saturdays, especially when we had a lot of prepping, planting, or gleaning to do. They also came on Thursday evenings to complete gleaning that the regular crew could not get at, and couldn't wait until Saturday. Many of our regular volunteers, whose age is simply a number, and unlisted at that, welcomed the YF&G's energetic and cheerful participation, even as we envied their young, flexible bodies. Maybe they gained something in turn. As Julian Clymer, Chair, Napa County Farm Bureau—Young Farmers and Ranchers, put in writing, "As active volunteers with the (Mission Farm volunteers), we all learned a lot about vegetable farming and ourselves!" I should add, they added another dimension to their participation in ministry with us. Hearing that we knew many members of the congregation and community that were battling depression on account of their social isolation, they began reaching out each week targeting several of these, provided cards for all the volunteers to sign, then delivered the cards and a bouquet of flowers to them! Wish you could read some of the "thank you" we received as a result of these acts of kindness made possible by the Young Farmers and Ranchers.

OFFERING UPDATE

Actual Offering Income for Nov: Total Offerings for FY20/21 (as of 30 Nov 20): \$50,276. \$262,811 which is 3.75% or \$10,227 below our budgeted offering income.

Total expenses remain in line with our budget and we have paid all bills received thus far.

Meditation:

"For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope." $(Romans\ 15:4)(ESV)$

Hope in God

Do you have a roof over your head? What about money set aside for retirement? Surely you carry house and vehicle insurance. And probably long-term-care insurance as well. Now, is your heart at ease? You've taken care of everything, right?

It certainly is wise to plan ahead, especially so that we will not be burdens to others. But listen to the words of Paul as recorded in 1 Timothy 6:17: "Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, Who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment" (1 Timothy 6:17).

In this Scripture, Paul reminds us that worldly wealth is still uncertain. He boldly states that, if we're trusting in worldly wealth, we are acting arrogantly. The only thing that is certain is God's love for us. He loves us and enables us to make our livings. He loves us so much that He "richly provides us with everything" – and here's the surprising part – "for our enjoyment"!

How do you plan to "enjoy" God's rich blessings to you? Take a cruise around the world? Buy a new luxury car every year? What really brings you enjoyment? God has blessed us, not so that we can enjoy His gifts by hoarding them, but so that His purposes in the world can be fulfilled. In verse 18, Paul tells us how to enjoy the gifts God gives us: "Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share."

When our hope is in God, we have no need to amass worldly wealth. When our hope is in God, we trust Him to provide for us all that we need and even more so that we'll always have something to share. In 2 Corinthians 9:10-11, Paul makes this point with these words: "Now He Who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God." God has called us to be His stewards. He also enables us to carry out His will. And there's another bonus! Not only will we receive enjoyment from sharing God's gifts, "In this way [we] will lay up treasure for [our]selves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that [we] may take hold of the life that is truly life" (1 Timothy 6:19). Put your hope in God.

Prayer: Lord, there are many things in this world that I can attach my heart to and place my security in. Grant me a discerning heart that helps me understand that my only security is found in You. Help me to faithfully read Your Word which will encourage me to place my hope and trust in You. In Christ's name I pray. Amen.


New mobile phone application makes supporting ministry even more convenient.
