Moses Talks to God at a Burning Bush

The Exodus

Exodus 2:23-4:17

Bible Point

God takes care of us.

Purpose

Are you ever overwhelmed? Maybe you can relate to feeling unprepared, inadequate, incapable, or caught off guard. We've all been there! It's human nature to occasionally feel like we're in way over our heads.

Moses understood. He might have been near panic when God explained his plans at the burning bush. God had a big job for Moses, and Moses just wasn't on board. Much like a child protesting, Moses argued with God: "Who am I to appear before Pharaoh? Who am I to lead the people of Israel out of Egypt?" Moses was overwhelmed. He wasn't ready. He wasn't important enough. He wasn't capable. Yet God reassured him, saying, "I will be with you."

Young children have intimate experience with feeling overwhelmed. They're not far beyond that stage of life where it was no biggie to melt down when things got to be too much. Your kids can relate to Moses and his fear that he just couldn't handle what God was calling him to. This lesson is a great reassurance that no matter what's happening, God always takes care of us.





What's your favorite color? Tell why.

Our papers told us which pompom colors we needed. In our Bible story, God told Moses what to do and gave him everything he'd need to do it. God gives us what we need, too! God takes care of us.



Help kids transition by cleaning up before sitting with their Connect Crews. A Connect Crew is a smaller group of kids with one Crew Guide.

Welcome

Hello, friends! I'm so happy to see you today. Let's sing our welcome song.



"Hello, My Friends" (Music CD track 2)

Let's say hello to our Crew Guides. They're our go-to friends who are here to have fun and learn along with us.

Kids give their Crew Guides an elbow bump.

Bible Point

No matter what's happening around us, God takes care of us.

That's our Bible Point today. Every time you hear the words "God takes care of us," cup your hands together like you're holding something in your hands and say "Amen!"

Repeat the Bible Point several times, inviting kids to follow along.

We often say "amen" at the end of our prayers. It's a way to ask God to take care of what we've talked to him about. Let's say a little prayer together now. Do what I do.

God, please take care of me. (point to yourself)
Amen, let it be. (hands together as if praying)
God, help me follow you (move arms as if marching)
In everything I do. (sweep both hands above head)
Thanks for taking care of me. (point to yourself)
Amen, let it be. (hands together as if praying)

Amen!

Repeat several times.

Repetition cements learning, so be sure to say today's Bible Point A LOT. Have fun with it! Kids will love listening for it and responding with "Amen!" Let's sing a song! God is good, and he takes care of us all the time!



Bible Memory Buddy & Verse

It's time to talk to Buzzly, our bee friend. He helps us beee close friends with Jesus! Let's call for Buzzly. Do what I do!

- Flap hands quickly like a bee.
- Make buzzing sounds.





- Show the Bible Memory Buddy poster.
- Explain that Tina is a termite and that people often think of termites as pests.
 They worry termites will eat up all the wood in their house!
- Have everyone move their fingers together like chomping mouths and say "Yummy!"
- God knows we worry, and he knows we can get upset. But no matter what, God takes care of us! (Amen!)

Show the Bible. The Bible is God's true story of love! Our Bible Memory Verse comes from the Bible. Let's say it together. I'll say a line, and then you repeat after me.

"If God (hold hands heavenward)
is for us, (point both thumbs at chest)
who (palms up, shrug)
can ever be against us?" (push palms out from body)
(Romans 8:31)

Let's praise God for taking care of us, no matter what!

Bible Discovery

Hold up a Bible. Today we'll hear a story from the Bible about a man named Moses. God had big plans for him! But Moses didn't think he was good enough to do the job. Moses was worried.

- Get cozy and circle up in knee-to-knee circles with Connect Crews.
- Tell about a time you were worried. Share a story from your own life first, then invite Crews to talk.
- Crew Guides give thumbs-up when everyone has shared.

Moses was worried, but God takes care of us. (Amen!) God knew Moses was worried and upset, so God promised to stick by him.

- Have everyone cheer.
- God took care of Moses and helped him. Let's find out what happened. We'll tell the story together.

Moses was a shepherd. It was his job to take care of his father-in-law's sheep. One day when he was outside with the sheep, he saw something very strange. Let's read about it in the Bible.

Read aloud Exodus 3:2-3.

God had a special job for Moses: He was going to help God's special people. Let's find out more. Do what I do.

Have children repeat after you and follow your actions.

God said, "Hi there, Moses! (wave)
You're gonna lead my people! (motion over imaginary crowd)
What's your reply?" (cup hand to ear)

Moses said, "Hey there, God! (wave with other hand).
Thanks a bunch, but (two thumbs-up)
You've got the wroooong guy!" (two thumbs-down)


Put your hands in your lap.

Supplies

- Bible

We call helpers Crew Guides. If you lead a small class, you can be the Crew Guide. Simply gather kids in a cozy circle around you. If you have helpers, form smaller groups so each child can be known—and so kids can befriend your helpers, too!

Read the verses from the Bible.
You're showing kids that God's Word is special. Don't worry—we've kept the verses short for young attention spans.



Moses didn't think he was good enough to do the important job God had for him. He was afraid and worried. But God takes care of us. (Amen!) God stuck by Moses and helped him. Let's find out what happened next. Do what I do.

Have children repeat after you and follow your actions.

But then God said, (hold up finger)
"I know you're worried, (make worried face)
And I know you're scared." (hands on sides of face)

"But I'm beside you, (lean toward the person next to you) I won't leave you in need. (wave finger back and forth) Trust in me; I always care." (hands over heart)

Put your hands in your lap.

Moses was worried no one would listen to him. He didn't think he was anyone important. God said he'd give Moses special skills so people would listen. Let's find out what Moses could do. Do what I do.

- Moses had a staff; that's a stick shepherds use to guide their sheep.
- Stand and pretend to hold a shepherd's staff beside you and bang it on the ground.
- God said, "Moses, throw down that staff!" Pretend to throw down the staff.
- Have everyone cover their eyes with their hands.
- The staff became... Pause. Open your eyes...a wiggly snake!
- Jump back in surprise at the imaginary snake.
- God said, "Pick up that wiggly snake by its tail!"
- Pretend to catch a wiggly snake by its tail and hold it up away from you.
- God said, "It's a staff again! I'll never fail!"
- Stand and pretend to hold a shepherd's staff and bang it on the ground.
- To prove he was true, God said, "Moses, be brave! I will always take care of you!"
- Hug yourself, and have everyone sit down again.

Wow! God would help Moses. God would show his power! But Moses was still a little worried about not knowing what to say. Let's read what God said to Moses.

Read aloud Exodus 4:12.

God would help Moses know what to say. Finally Moses understood that God would stick with him and help him, even when the job was really big and important. Moses knew that with God's help he really could lead God's people, and all because God showed him that God takes care of us. (Amen!)

Apply-1. Options

Choose one—or all—of these activities to support kids' learning after Bible Discovery.

Game

Supplies: *Music* CD, media player Play a game like Follow the Leader.

- Have children form a line behind you or their Crew Guides and hold hands and close their eyes.
- Play "God Is for Me" (Music CD track 6) as Crew Guides lead their Crews around the room. Have fun leading kids around tables, chairs, and other classroom objects.
- Remind children to keep their eyes closed and hold hands as they trust their leaders to take them around the room.
- What was it like for you to follow the leader with your eyes closed?

Moses was worried about leading God's people. But God stuck with Moses like your leader stuck with you! God takes care of us, too. (Amen!)



Food-n-Friendship

Supplies: snack, napkins, hand cleanser, *Music* CD, media player

Give a napkin to a friend and say, "God takes care of us!" (Amen!)



- Eat snack together.
- When we pray, we talk with God. Who has something we can talk with God about?
- Pray together.

God takes care of us. (Amen!) Let's show God's care and help each other clean up!


Coloring Creation



God takes care of us (Amen!) just like he took care of Moses, who was worried he'd never be able to do the job God told him to do.

- Review the Bible story as you identify Moses and the burning bush.
- Color the picture.
- Help kids pinch off bits of orange tissue paper and then stick the "flames" to the bush with a glue stick.
- Play music as kids create.

Goodbye Circle

It's almost time to say goodbye! Let's sing our goodbye song as we join hands and make one big circle!



"Goodbye, My Friends" (*Music* CD track 4)

God takes care of us. (Amen!) God never leaves us. God sticks by us like he stuck by Moses. He even sent his one and only Son, Jesus, to be our forever friend. We can always talk with Jesus. Let's talk with him right now. I'll say words, and you do motions with me.

- Jesus, please take care of me when I'm scared. (pat a friend's back)
- Jesus, please take care of me when I worry. (hug a friend)
- Jesus, please take care of me when I don't know what to do. (scratch head)
- Jesus, thanks for being with us every day! (high-five someone)

Repeat a few times. If you have a small class, add each child's name as you pray.


- Show the Bible Memory Buddy poster, and remind kids that Tina Termite can help us remember that God takes care of us. (Amen!)
- Invite Crew Guides to share Jesus' love and give each child a Tina sticker. Remind kids that Tina Termite likes to chomp on wood. Have children put their hands together with fingers interlocking to make chomping mouths to take the stickers. As they give each child a sticker, Crew Guides say, "God takes care of us, and that means you, [child's name]."
- Kids can wear their stickers or take them home to put on a notebook or water bottle.

Bible Point


God takes care of us.

Purpose

Think of a time you've been spared. Rescued, even. Maybe you barely avoided a car accident, or a heavy storm passed over your house with no consequences. Or maybe you recovered quickly from an accident or were able to clean up after a storm.

In scary and difficult times, it can be hard to trust God, especially when things don't work out the way we expect or hope. It can be hard to determine how God took care of us when we lost a lot. But even in the most difficult of circumstances, God is present, and he still rescues today.

Young children experience fears and hard times just as we do. Knowing God will take care of them gives them something to hold on to. Encourage the kids in your class to believe that God will come through for them, even if it's not in the way they expect. And point them to Jesus, our rescuer and forever friend.

God, thanks for coming to my rescue time and again. Please show these little ones your care through me today. In Jesus' name, amen.







Moses Talks to God at a Burning Bush

Bible Point

God takes care of us...even when we feel like we're not good enough.

Purpose

We can all relate to feeling like we're falling short. When pressures around us tighten, it's easy to feel like we're in over our head, like we'll never be smart enough, capable enough, financially stable enough or any other "enough." There are times the sea of high expectations and crushing busyness is simply overwhelming.

Moses felt like he came up short as well. When God first told him what he was supposed to do, Moses asked, "Who am I to appear before Pharaoh? Who am I to lead the people of Israel out of Egypt?" Moses was bewildered, intimidated, and, yes, overwhelmed. God reassured him, saying, "I will be with you." But still Moses protested. Surely he couldn't be up to the enormous task.

Your elementary kids wonder every day whether they're good enough. They wonder if their friends will stick with them. They wonder whether they'll ever figure out multiplication when it seems like everyone else has it mastered. This lesson is a great opportunity to help your kids gain confidence through Moses' experience and know that, even when we feel most unworthy, God never fails us. God takes care of us.






Toppling Cup Towers



Bible Memory Buddy & Verse

Tina Termite is our Bible Memory Buddy. Show the Bible Memory Buddy poster. How much do you know about termites? Let's find out with a This-or-That Challenge! You'll hear two fun facts. It's up to you to decide which is true—this fact or that!

- Termites live interesting lives—but just how long do they live? Do you think termites live for one month or 50 years?
- Have everyone hold up one finger to vote for this (one month) or yell out "Fifty!" to vote for that (50 years).
- Make a drumroll sound by patting your thighs or the floor.
- Dramatically give the answer: The queens of some types of termites can live up to 50 years in the right conditions! Most workers live around five years, though.
- Watch the Bible Memory Buddy video to find out more about Tina Termite.



Tina Termite Bible Memory Buddy video (Week 2)



Show the Bible. The Bible is God's true story of love. Each book in the Bible is made up of chapters and verses. Chapters are longer, and verses are usually about one sentence. Our Bible Memory Verse is Romans 8:31. Let's say the verse together. I'll say a line, and then you repeat after me.

"If God (hold hands heavenward)
is for us, (point both thumbs at chest)
who (palms up, shrug)
can ever be against us?" (push palms out from body)
(Romans 8:31)

God takes care of us. (Amen!) Even when we feel like a failure, God doesn't think about us like that. He loves us like crazy all the time! Let's celebrate with another song. Ready?

Bible Discovery

Circle Up & Connect

Let's circle up and spend a little time simply getting to know each other in smaller groups called Connect Crews.

- Arrange kids into Connect Crews with one helper—or Crew Guide per group.
- Invite kids to sit in knee-to-knee circles with their Connect Crews.
- Have Connect Crews come up with a special handshake to give their Crew Guides and each other.
- Have kids take turns saying their names and answering this question. Crew Guides go first.
- What's something you've done that you're proud of?

Experience the Bible Story

In today's story we'll read about a man named Moses who felt like he wasn't good enough to do the important job God gave him.

Instead of just listening, you'll help me tell the story and play an important part. Be ready to join in as I tell you. You can read Moses' whole story in the book of Exodus in the Bible.

God's people, the Israelites, had been enslaved in Egypt for many years. They were mistreated and miserable. Encourage kids to moan and groan. They cried out to God to help them. Have kids cry out, "Help us!" Let's read about it.

Read aloud Exodus 2:23-25.

God decided to work through Moses to free his people. He chose to tell this to Moses while he was shepherding sheep on a mountainside. Imagine you all are on a mountainside. Have kids point out imaginary things they see like trees, grass, sheep, and clouds.


Yup. A pretty normal day in the great outdoors. Freeze suddenly and look ahead. Whoa! Moses stopped in his tracks. Did he smell smoke? Have kids sniff with you; then shield your eyes as if looking at something far away. Did Moses see red-hot flames up ahead? Have everyone shield their eyes and look at an imaginary spot you point toward. What was on fire?

Moses went over for a better look. A bush was engulfed in flames. Quick! Call the fire department. Everyone, make siren sounds that get louder and louder as I raise my arms higher. Slowly raise your arms as kids make siren sounds. Then motion for kids to stop.

Supplies

- Bible

We call helpers Crew Guides, If you lead a small class, you can be the Crew Guide. Simply circle up with the kids. If you have helpers, form smaller groups so each child can be known and so kids can befriend your helpers, too!



Wait! Stop the alarm. The bush is on fire, but it's not burning up. The bush wasn't charring or falling down; it was just burning. Scratch your head as if puzzled. Let's send back the fire trucks. Start your siren sounds again, and get quieter as I move my arms down. As kids make siren sounds, slowly lower your arms until it's quiet again.

It's hard to imagine such a sight, but this picture may help a little. Show the Bible Story poster. Let's read about what happened.



Read aloud Exodus 3:3-6.

Wow. Put yourself in Moses' position—you're just out on the mountain minding your own business, and the next thing you know, God's talking to you from a burning bush. Have kids raise their hands and wave them like flames, making crackling noises.

Moses was afraid. After all, who was he to talk to God? Speaking of talking, let's circle up and talk in our Connect Crews for a bit.

- Have Crews sit in knee-to-knee circles.
- Do you think you are important enough for God to talk to? Why or why not?
- Give Crews a few minutes to talk, then ask another question.
- Do you believe God has talked to you? Explain.
- Crew Guides give thumbs-up when their conversations have ended.

God talked to Moses about his people, the Israelites. God knew they were suffering and that Moses was just the person to lead them out of Egypt into the Promised Land. But Moses was like, "Who, me?" Say that with me in your most trembly, nervous voices. Pause and say in a trembly, nervous voice, "Who, me?"

God reassured Moses. He said, "I'll be there with you, Moses." God was telling Moses that even when we don't feel like we're good enough, God takes care of us. (Amen!) But Moses still didn't think this was a good idea. Let's read what Moses said.



Read aloud Exodus 3:13-15.

God was in charge, not Moses. God had *always* kept his promises to help and take care his people, and that wasn't going to change. But Moses was still nervous. God was asking him to lead thousands of people on a treacherous journey into a new life. Not only that, Moses would have to go to the elders of Israel and the king of Egypt—Pharaoh himself.

Moses asked, "What if they don't believe me?" Say that with me in your most trembly, nervous voices again. Pause and say in a trembly, nervous voice, "What if they don't believe me?"

God had Moses' back and would help in surprising ways! One way involves a snake! Have kids stand, spread out, and follow your lead.

God told Moses to throw down his shepherd's staff. Pretend to throw down the staff. **It turned into a serpent!** Making hissing noises, and jump back in surprise. **God told Moses to pick up the serpent by its tail,** (make hissing noises as you pretend to pick it up by the wiggly tail) **and it turned back into a shepherd's staff.** Tap it like it's a shepherd's staff again.

But Moses was still worried. Let's read about one more thing he was worried about.



Read aloud Exodus 4:10.

I get tongue-tied sometimes, too. Especially when I have to talk in front of a bunch of people. Let's try some tongue twisters with your Connect Crews. Everyone, go around your Crew circle and take turns saying, "The big burning berry bush bent backward" as fast as you can. Give time for Crews to try this tongue twister.

Ugh! Why is being tongue-tied so frustrating? Take responses from the whole group.

You know what you need to say, but you can't do it on your own! Your mouth won't cooperate with your brain! Maybe now we understand how Moses may have felt. But God was still God, and God's response is pretty cool.



Read aloud Exodus 4:11-12.

God made mouths, and he'll help them talk! But even with all that, Moses still wasn't confident he could do what God was asking. And again, God helped. God said Moses could take his brother Aaron along.

Moses didn't feel like he was good enough to lead God's people. But despite Moses' worries, God provided: miracles, words, a brother! God didn't change his mind about Moses because God takes care of us. (Amen!)


The Heart of the Matter


I have a challenge for you. It's kind of hard, but I believe all of you can do it.

- Have kids stand and hold their arms straight out in front of them.
- Place a book or Bible on each person's arms.
- Challenge kids to hold the book for one minute.

Start the countdown video again.

- After 15 seconds, say, Great job!
- After 30 seconds, ask, How do your arms feel? Invite responses from the whole group.
- After 45 seconds, say, Can you keep those arms up? Take a few responses. Kids may begin dropping their arms.





After 60 seconds, say, Moses felt he didn't have the strength to do the amazing things God wanted him to do on his own. But he didn't have to! God supported and helped him. Let's support and help each other.

- Have each Crew form a circle, and have everyone rest their outstretched hands on the shoulders of the person in front of them so each person is supporting the hands of someone holding a book.
- How do you feel now with your friends helping you? What's the difference?

Now you have support. You don't have to muster up the strength you need by yourself. God supported and helped Moses, and he helps us, too. God takes care of us. (Amen!) With the "Amen!" response, let kids lower the books to the floor. Have everyone pick up and collect the books.

Let's talk in our Connect Crews again.

- Have Connect Crews form knee-to-knee circles.
- Tell about something you're facing right now that you need God's help for. Invite Crew Guides to share first.
- Give Connect Crews a few minutes to discuss.
- Lead a prayer with the whole group, asking God to take care of each person and help with the challenges each person is facing.

God never gave up on Moses. And God won't give up on us. God takes care of us. (Amen!)

Distribute Bibles, and help kids find and read Exodus 3:4-6.


Seems like strange instructions. But let's take off our shoes, too. Have kids take off their shoes and place them aside.

Some Bible researchers say the people in Egypt were expected to take off their sandals in a king's presence. It was disrespectful to keep them on. So when God told Moses to take off his shoes, it was like he was telling Moses, "I'm here, there is no one like me, and I'm in charge."

I wonder, where will your feet go later today or tomorrow? How will God take care of you in that place? Let's think about that as we make some foot art.

- Give each person a piece of paper, and have each person trace two feet on the paper.
- Inside one foot, have kids write where they'll go.
- Inside the other foot, have kids write this prayer: "God, please help me..." Kids can finish the sentence with ways they need God's help and care.
- Have kids put their shoes back on.

God takes care of us. (Amen!) He promised to be with Moses, and he'll be with you wherever you go.




Game





- Crew Guides give thumbs-up when everyone has received a sticker.




Fold a slithering snake. Surprise a family member .

...by holding the "snake" together at the sides...then releasing it quickly. It'll "slither" across the room!


Here's how:
