Bible Point

God takes care of us.

Purpose

Think of something that seems impossible right now in your life. You can't see how good can come of it. You have or soon will run out of ways to fix it. Even though it's hard, don't lose hope in God.

Remember what Moses said in Exodus 14: "Don't be afraid. Just stand still and watch the Lord rescue you today...The Lord himself will fight for you. Just stay calm." What you are going through might be overwhelming, but God takes care of you just as he took care of the Israelites. Stay calm and wait for him.

As the young children in your class learn they can trust God, you can model your faith and trust in God. The more they see you trusting God, the more they can cling to him when they face hard times.

God, I know you can do the impossible. Help me demonstrate for kids that you will make a way, no matter the situation. In Jesus' name, amen.





Bible Point

Today's Bible Point is God takes care of us. Every time you hear the words "God takes care of us," cup your hands together like you're holding something in your hands and say "Amen!" Let's try it together.

Repeat several times.

Amen means "so be it." We end our prayers with "amen" because we're asking God to take care of the things we talked to him about. Let's say a prayer together right now. I'll say the words, and you can do the motions with me.

God, please take care of me. (point to yourself)
Amen, let it be. (hands together as if praying)
God, you will make a way (move hands forward together as if making a path)
Each and every day. (sweep both hands in front of you)
Thanks for taking care of me. (point to yourself)
Amen, let it be. (hands together as if praying)

Repeat the prayer, this time inviting kids to repeat the words after you.


It's time to talk to our friend Buzzly Bee. He helps us beee close friends with God! Let's call for Buzzly. Do what I do!

- Make buzzing sounds.






- Show the Bible Memory Buddy poster.
- Have everyone pinch their fingers together as if they're little bugs and say, God takes care of us. (Amen!)



"If God (hold hands heavenward)

God is with us every day; even days that don't go so well. When hard times come and we don't know what to do, we can ask God to help and rescue us. He will! Let's sing about that now.





Bible Discovery

- Hold up a Bible. Today our Bible story tells about how God took care of his people, the Israelites. And we'll find out God takes care of us. (Amen!) The Israelites were on a journey to find a new place to live.
 - Have Connect Crews get comfy in knee-to-knee circles.
 - Tell about a journey or trip you've taken.
 - Invite Crew Guides to share first.
 - Crew Guides give thumbs-up when everyone has shared.

The Israelites were moving away from a place called Egypt, where they had been treated badly. They hadn't gotten very far when they reached a big sea called the Red Sea. Pretend with me that you're on the edge of a big sea. Here's the sea!

- Lay the two blue plastic tablecloths or towels side by side on the floor near Crews.
- Have everyone wave their arms out at their sides like a wavy sea.
- Together, make "whoosh, whoosh, whoosh" or "crash, crash" sounds like waves.

God told the Israelites, "Stay here a little bit. I'm going to do something to show the Egyptians how great I am." So the Israelites camped there overnight. They knew God takes care of us. (Amen!) Let's rest like they did.

- Lie down and pretend to sleep.
- Sit up and stretch, as if waking up.

But while the Israelites were camping by the sea, the Egyptians decided they didn't want to let them leave. They decided to chase them! They loaded up some chariots, hopped on their horses, and started coming after the Israelites!

- Cover mouth and say, "Oh no!"
- Pat legs to make the sound of horses running.

Some of the Israelites were very scared. They forgot that God takes care of us. (Amen!) But their leader, Moses, didn't forget. Let's read in the Bible what happened.

Read aloud Exodus 14:13-14.

Moses reminded God's people that God would take care of them. God would make a way for them to get away from the Egyptians. Let's find out what happened.

Supplies

- Bible
- "The Israelites Cross the Red Sea" Bible Story poster
- 2 blue plastic tablecloths or towels

We call helpers Crew Guides, If you lead a small class, you can be the Crew Guide. Simply gather kids in a cozy circle around you. If you have helpers, form smaller groups so each child can be known—and so kids can befriend your helpers, too!

Read the verses from a kid-friendly Bible translation. You're showing kids that God's Word is special. And don't worry; we've kept the verses short for young attention spans.

Read aloud Exodus 14:21-22.

God told Moses to hold his hand over the sea. Hold up your hand, **God divided the water so the Israelites could walk through on a dry path.** Point to the sea made of tablecloths or towels. **Help me divide this sea like God did.**


- Kids each raise a hand like Moses did.
- Two people partially raise the tablecloths or towels at the point where they meet to "part the sea."
- Kids walk through and gather on the opposite side.

Show the Bible Story poster. **God took care of the Israelites in an incredible way, and God takes care of us.** (Amen!)

- Point out the walls of water and the dry path on the poster.
- Point out the grown-up carrying a little child through the water.
- Tell about a neat way someone took care of you. Invite a few responses from the whole group.

God gives us people to take care of us, and God gave his people Moses to help them. Moses trusted God. God made the walls of water go back down again, and the Egyptians didn't catch God's people! God made a way for his people to keep moving to their new home. I'm so glad God takes care of us. (Amen!)

- Lower the tablecloths or towels to show the sea coming back together, and place them on the ground.
- Lead kids in a prayer, thanking God for taking care of us.

Remember Tina Termite? She reminds us that God takes care of us. (Amen!)


- Show the Bible Memory Buddy poster.



Bible Point

God takes care of us...and always makes a way for us.

Purpose

It's hard to imagine a more desperate situation than the one the Israelites found themselves in at the banks of the Red Sea. Vast water ahead and a vicious army behind. No time or way to escape.

That feeling of helplessness isn't reserved for biblical characters from the past. Modern adults face daily situations that can throw them into a helpless state. A concerning diagnosis. A pink slip. Not knowing where the money's going to come from for next month's bills.

Kids, even more than adults, may tend to feel powerless. They can't stop their parents from divorcing. They can't help Mom find a new job. But they can turn to God for help. We all can turn to God—he's our refuge, our shield, our protector.

Use this lesson to help kids know they can turn to God in any and every situation. They can pray to him, they can trust him, and they can count on the absolute knowledge that God *always* loves and cares for them.



Bible Memory Buddy & Verse

Let's meet our Bible Memory Buddy. It's Tina Termite! Show the Bible Memory Buddy poster. Termites eat a lot. Let's see what you know—or don't know—about how much they eat with a This-or-That Challenge! You'll hear two fun facts about termites. It's up to you to decide which is true—this fact or that!

- In a year's time, some termites can eat as much grass as another animal. Is that animal a goat or a cow?
- Have everyone "baa" to vote for this (a goat) or "moo" to vote for that (a cow).
- Make a drumroll sound by patting your thighs or the floor.
- Dramatically give the answer: Some termites can eat as much grass as a cow!
- Watch today's Bible Memory Buddy video about Tina Termite.



Tina Termite Bible Memory Buddy video (Week 4)



Show the Bible. The Bible is God's true story of love. Every part of the Bible is there for a reason, showing us God's loving plan for us. Our Bible Memory Verse is Romans 8:31. Let's say the verse together. I'll say a line, and then you repeat after me.

"If God (hold hands heavenward)
is for us, (point both thumbs at chest)
who (palms up, shrug)
can ever be against us?" (push palms out from body)
(Romans 8:31)

God takes care of us. (Amen!) God is good in every way, so let's sing about that!

Bible Discovery

Circle Up & Connect

Let's circle up and spend a little time simply getting to know each other in smaller groups called Connect Crews.

- Arrange kids into Connect Crews, with one helper—or Crew Guide per group.
- Invite kids to sit in knee-to-knee circles with their Connect Crews.
- Have kids give their Crew Guides and each other wavy high-fives.
- Have kids take turns saying their names and answering this question. Crew Guides go first.
- If you had to get across a lake in a hurry, would you rather use a jet ski or a boat? Why?

Experience the Bible Story

Hold up the Bible. Now it's time to dive into a story from the Bible. But I need your help. Just do what I do and get ready to move!

Today we'll all be God's people, the Israelites. Point to yourself with a thumb. **Our story comes from the book of Exodus in the Bible.**

For a very long time now, we've been living in Egypt, working under the hot Egyptian sun. It's so hot! Pretend to wipe sweat off your brow. Pharaoh, the ruler of Egypt, has really been mean to us. What a hard-hearted mean guy! Stand with hands on hips.

But we know that God takes care of us. (Amen!) And God just came through in a huge way for us! He sent 10 plagues on Egypt to show Pharaoh who's boss. Not one plague. Hold up one finger. Not two plagues. Hold up two fingers. TEN plagues! Hold up 10 fingers.

Pharaoh got so scared that he told us to leave Egypt! We're finally free! High-five several kids.

C'mon, there's no time to lose. Let's hurry up and get out of here before Pharaoh changes his mind. Quick! Run to your tent and pack up your clothes. Run to one side of the room and pretend to pack a bag.

Now run to the animal pen and get the sheep tied up and ready to go. Run to the other side of the room and pretend to tie rope. Good job! Now count to make sure you have everyone in your family. Are you missing anyone? Count three people and make sure. Pat three different people on the head as you count to three.

Okay, we're ready! Let's go! Time to leave Egypt for good! Follow me! Lead everyone in a circle around the room.

We call helpers Crew Guides. If you lead a small class, you can be the Crew Guide. Simply circle up with the kids. If you have helpers, form smaller groups so each child can be known—and so kids can befriend your helpers, too! All God's people, and all their animals, left Egypt and traveled through the wilderness. I don't know about you, but all this walking has made me tired. Stretch and yawn. I think it's time to camp for the night. Have everyone sit down in Connect Crews.

First let's cook some dinner. Pretend to stir a pot. **Now let's chow down.** Pretend to eat. **That was good!** Rub your tummy. **Let's get a good night's sleep so we can travel some more tomorrow. Goodnight!** Lay your head on your hands and pretend to sleep.

Rise and shine! Time to get up and get moving! Stretch and yawn again. The farther we get away from Egypt, the better! C'mon, follow me. Lead everyone in a circle around the room in the opposite direction.

God's people walked and walked, and they finally came to the shores of the Red Sea. There was so much water it looked like an ocean! Shield eyes with one hand and point in the distance with the other. How are we ever going to get across? Scratch head as if confused.

As if a huge sea wasn't a big enough problem, there was even bigger trouble on the way. Listen to this.



Read aloud Exodus 14:5-6.

Oh no! Pharaoh changed his mind about letting the Israelites go! Put hands over mouth as if surprised. He sent all his soldiers on their chariots to chase after God's people!

Wait! What's that I hear? Cup hand to ear. **Is that horses I hear?** Pat thighs to make hoofbeat sounds. **Oh no! The chariots must be getting closer!** Pat thighs louder and faster. **What are we going to do?** Grab head in despair.

Should we run for it? Run in place. No, there's nowhere to run. The Egyptians are right behind us! Should we try to swim? Pretend to swim. No, we'll never make it across. We're trapped!


Just then, when all hope was gone, this is what happened.



Read aloud Exodus 14:13-14.

Show the Bible Story poster. God moved the water in the Red Sea! He just parted it so there was a dry path in the middle! It was a miracle! Huge walls of water on both sides, held in place by God's mighty hand. God's people passed right through the sea on dry ground. What a sight! Walk in place slowly, with hands over mouth as if in awe.

When all God's people were safely on the other side, God let the water flow



back in place, covering the Egyptian chariots. The Israelites were safe! High-five someone nearby. God's people found out in a big way that God takes care of us (Amen!) and always makes a way for us. Thank you, God! You made a way for us. Clap and cheer.

Lead everyone in applause for their participation, then have kids sit with their Connect Crews.

The Heart of the Matter

In our Bible story, God's people faced an impossible situation. Ahead of them lay a huge sea, with no way to get across. Behind them came the Egyptians, with their chariots and swords. The Israelites were stuck—they had no way to save themselves. Let's talk in our Connect Crews.

- When is a time you felt you were in an impossible situation or a time you just couldn't figure out a solution? Crew Guides, you can share first.
- Crew Guides give thumbs-up when everyone has shared.


Thanks for sharing. It's tough to be in a situation where you feel helpless. Maybe your parents are getting a divorce and there's nothing you can do about it. Or maybe your best friend is moving away or someone you know is sick.

But no situation is impossible for God! God takes care of us (Amen!) and always makes a way for us. Let's make something to remember that.

- Give each Crew brown and blue paper. Set out scissors, markers, and glue sticks to share in each Crew.
- Holding the blue paper horizontally, fold in both sides to meet in the center. Then unfold.
- In the center, write a few words to describe a current situation where you need God's help.
- Glue a brown paper strip over the words.

Even when life is rough and things feel impossible, God still loves us and is always with us. God takes care of us (Amen!) and always makes a way for us. Take your Red Sea reminder home to help you remember that God's got every situation in your life covered!

After God parted the Red Sea, God's people were amazed! They sang a song of victory to God. Let's look at a little part of that song.




Distribute Bibles, and help kids find and read Exodus 15:1-2 together.

What's your favorite way to praise God?

God's people used a song to praise him for taking care of them. Since we know that God takes care of us, (Amen!) let's praise God, too! You can write a song, draw a picture, create a poem, or just write a thank-you note—however you want to praise God is good!

- Distribute paper, pens, and markers.
- Allow time for kids (and Crew Guides!) to create praises to God.
- Have kids share and explain their creations within their Crews.

With kids' permission, snap pictures of their creations with a smartphone to post on your church's social media page. What a great way for kids to lead their church family in worship!



Game


Supplies

- bottles of bubble solution with wands (1 for every 3 kids), paper
 - Have kids form trios at one end of the room.
 - Give each trio a bottle of bubble solution with a wand. Have sheets of paper available.
 - Explain that one person in each group will blow bubbles while the other two players try to get the bubbles to the other side of the room. They can wave hands, fan sheets of paper, or huff and puff—but they can't touch the bubbles.
 - At the other side of the room, switch roles. Play until each person has had a chance to blow bubbles.
 - What was easy or hard about this game?

You had trouble getting the bubbles all the way across the room. That's because you were limited by the natural properties of bubbles, air currents, and so on. But God is never limited by anything. He had no trouble parting the Red Sea and getting his people across safely. His power is incredible!

When is a time you saw God's power in your life?

God takes care of us. (Amen!) No matter what situation you find yourself in, God is right there with you. He loves you and cares what happens to you. He'll never leave you—never!



Friendship Findle

Invite kids to sit in knee-to-knee circles with their Connect Crews.

No situation is too hard for God! God takes care of us (Amen!) and always makes a way for us.

Have members of each Connect Crew place one arm in the center of the Crew circle and give God a big cheer, ending by shouting, "God takes care of us. Amen!"

Our Bible Memory Buddy Tina Termite can help us remember God takes care of us (Amen!) You'll each receive a Tina Termite sticker to help you remember God's love and goodness throughout your week. You can wear it now or take it home with you. Crew Guides will give each person a sticker like this.

- Demonstrate the following actions with a Connect Crew.
- Kids will sit in a circle. Each child will step into the center of the circle to receive a sticker from the Crew Guide.
- As they give each child a Bible Memory Buddy sticker, Crew Guides say, "[Child's name], God will always take care of you!"

After receiving stickers, kids will return to their original spots in the circle. Crew Guides give thumbs-up when everyone has received a sticker.

When everyone is sitting in a Crew circle, shout, When I count to three, shout the Bible Point with me. One, two, three! God takes care of us! (Amen!)

God knew we would go through hard times, and he sent Jesus to show us his love. Jesus always knows what's happening in our lives, and he's always ready to help us.

Close your eyes and think of someone you know who's going through a hard time. Pause. Place one palm over the other to remind you that no matter what the situation, Jesus has it covered. Pause. Listen while I read something about our friend Jesus. As you listen, keep your palms together.

- Read the first section of the Unit 2, Week 4 Take-It-Home Flyer.
- Now I'll give you one of these flyers to help you talk about Jesus' love in your Connect Crews and at home, too. Consider this practice time for talking about Jesus with your family at home.
- Distribute Take-It-Home Flyers to Crew Guides, and have them share about their own friendship with Jesus as they discuss the "Talk Starter" question with their Crews.
- Kids share prayer requests—things they'd like to tell Jesus—in their Connect Crews.
- Connect Crews pray together.
- Crew Guides distribute Take-It-Home Flyers and follow the directions to help kids fold the paper to "fly" home.




Make this page fly home!


Fold a flyer. Ask a family member to pick a spot at least 20 feet away where you're to land your plane -----


...then close your eyes, turn in a circle three times, and without looking, launch your flyer. How close did you get?

Here's how:

- Fold the paper in half as shown.
- 2 Unfold, and then fold the top two corners to the center line to create flaps.
- Fold each side to the center again.







- Fold in half, then diagonally fold over the edge of the paper to make a wing.
- **5** Flip over and fold another wing to match the other side.
- **6** Grab the middle, and let it fly!
