## **“Strength in our Weakness”**

*Encouragement from 2 Corinthians*

COVID has been exhausting on many levels. Even as it appears that in some ways we are coming out of the pandemic, in many ways the disruption is far from over. So many changes, upheavals, and canceled plans have left many exhausted,

discouraged, and stressed – sometimes beyond what we even realize.

We need strength. We need encouragement. God provides this in abundance through His grace.

This summer, we will focus on encouraging words from Paul’s second letter to the Corinthians. Rather than going verse by verse through the entire book (as we normally do!), we’re just going to hit some of the highlights, as we seek “*strength in our weakness.*” in God’s Word.

## *Asking for Care from a Stephen Minister*



**When Do We Need God's Love Most?** Of course, we need that love every second of our lives. But at times God's love is especially precious to us, such as when: we lose a loved one life becomes so confusing that we do not know where to turn we are dealing with an illness, or caring for a loved one who is ill or life just becomes meaningless, and depression sets in At times like

these, it is especially important to have someone who cares. Our congregation has trained twelve Stephen Ministers who offer a ministry of Christian caring for those in need.

Suffering on our own is not God's intent for us. Jesus promises, "*Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest*" (Matthew 11:28). We can receive this promised rest when we turn to one another for comfort and help. God did not create us to be independent. We were created to be *interdependent*. God's Word is clear: "*It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him*" (Genesis 2:18). The New Testament underscores this theme with more than 50 verses that contain the words "one another" with admonitions such as "*love one another,*" "*encourage one another,*" "*build up one another,*" and "*pray for one another.*" We are to allow other people to love, encourage, build up, and pray for us.

Our Stephen Ministers know about receiving care. Many of them have received care themselves at some point in their lives – something that has motivated them to give care now. They know how difficult it is to ask for help, but they also know the great personal and spiritual growth and healing that follow. They know how to respond in a loving, caring, and nonjudgmental manner. They are equipped, ready, and waiting to provide the comfort and care God very much desires you to have.

If you find yourself now or in the future facing difficulties in life, do not suffer alone. Take the courageous step of seeking help. Open your heart to receiving God's love and grace through another person. Our Stephen Ministry offers the opportunity for a very confidential relationship with someone who will listen to you and provide you with the care and encouragement you need, helping Christ to bring rest to your weary, burdened heart.

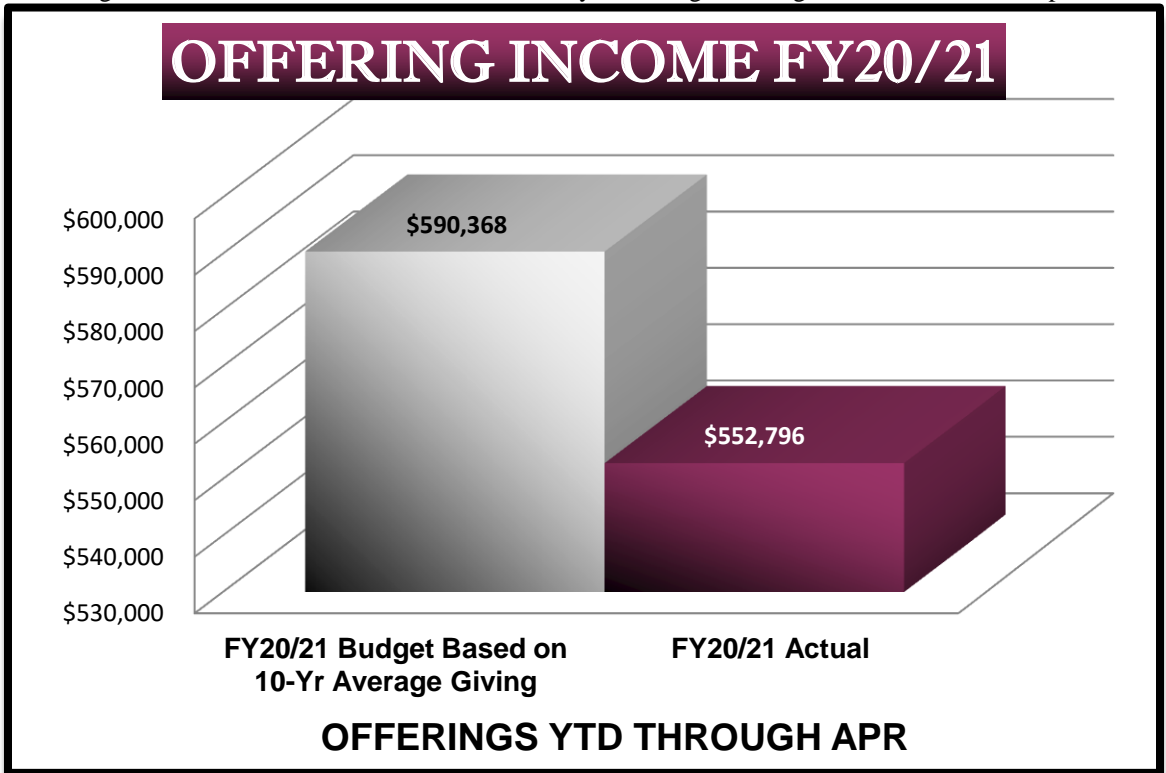

### Meditation:

*“Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed...the dead will be raised imperishable...and this mortal body must put on immortality...The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, Who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.” (I Corinthians 15:51-57)(ESV)*

## We’ve Won!

We’ve all been stung by death. Children die. People in peak physical condition die. Sickness or age or accident creeps up on us, and we all die. Sounds morbid, doesn’t it? But death is a final and painful reality. When death comes to one we love, no matter the age of the person, we are stung. For some the sting remains, even though it may be eased

by passing time. When death comes to a Christian, however, the sting of death is momentary. We who mourn do not mourn without hope, for we know that death is not the end.

The disciples who watched their Savior hang on the cross were stung by His death. They mourned without hope, for they didn't know His death was not permanent. That hopelessness turned to great joy, though, when Christ appeared to them alive! Because He rose from the dead, we, too, shall rise. Death could not triumph over Christ and it cannot triumph over us. Through Christ, we've won! Death is defeated. Eternal life begins at our Baptism and carries us into Heaven. Jesus comforted His disciples with these words of hope: ***“Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in Me. In My Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with Me that you also may be where I am”*** (John 14:1-3). What a profound mystery this is! Our only response is to cry, “Thanks be to God!” The sting of death is removed because, in Christ, we've won!

**Prayer:** Dear Lord, You have taken away the sting of death through Your death and resurrection. You have given me a new victorious life to live in You each day. Keep me steadfast in faith until the end and use me to spread the Good News of victory in Jesus. In His name I pray. Amen.

Once they accomplish their continued training goals with our new dog for the next six weeks, they will have their final evaluation by an LCC trainer who will then officially certify them. That is when they can all begin ministry here in Napa and beyond! Please mark your calendars for **July 11<sup>th</sup>** which will be the commissioning of our new dog as well as the entire St. John's LCC K9 Comfort Dog team during the church service that day.

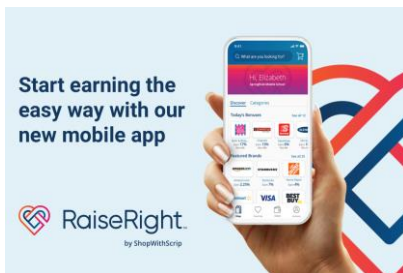

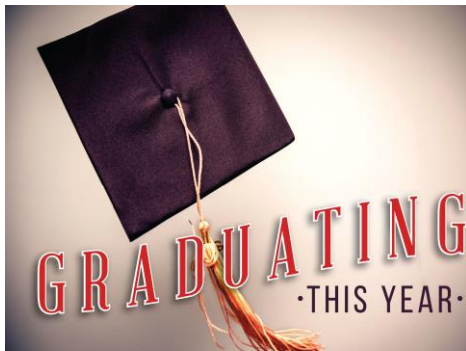

# So, What's New at the Farm?

There has been a whole lot of planting going on at the Mission Farm. Watching some of our volunteers on their hands and knees planting onions, I thought to myself, “Of all the things I’ve loved and lost, I miss my flexibility the most!”

A lot of the work by the volunteers does require the ability to kneel and stoop: planting, weeding, and some gleaning. Perhaps you are thinking, “I appreciate the Farm’s mission. I’d like to help. But of all the things I’ve loved and lost...” However, not all that the volunteers do requires bending and stooping. A good deal is done while standing up straight or slightly bending: harvesting green beans, fruit from the trees, tomatoes, eggplant, onions, cucumbers, peppers, etc. Add to that list prepping the produce to send into the Food Bank: washing, wiping, sorting, trimming off the greens or roots, packing, weighing, etc. In fact we are getting quickly to that time of year when prepping the produce takes as much of the labor force’s time as the planting and weeding!

Nor does the volunteer have to be out there every work day (Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday morning). Perhaps you can only come one day a week. Great! It all helps. Or you might be willing to come out on a special work day when an appeal goes out for many helping hands! That’s great too. Just let me know, and I’ll add you to our email list and we’ll send you “All Hands on Deck” notices.

We are harvesting a lot of cool weather crops even as we are just about finished planting the summer crops. So we are sending produce into the Food Bank several times each week. As of the end of April we have sent in 1,816.75 lbs. of produce. That poundage (I can almost already say “tonnage”) will begin adding up quickly. This year, the entire field available to us for farming is being put into production.

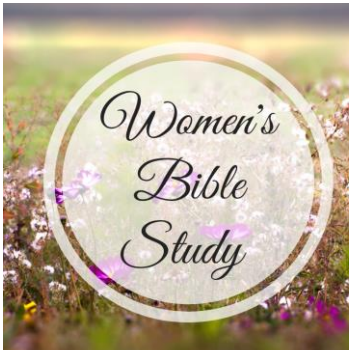
