- Worship Survey: Results of the recent worship survey



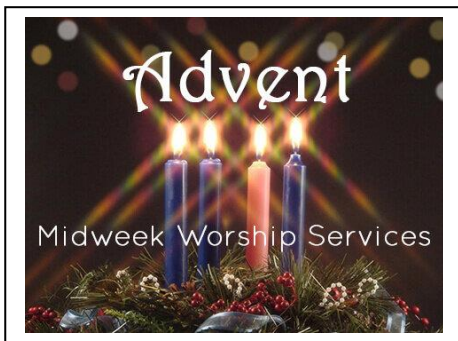
Advent Worship Series

He Comes Bearing Gifts

Our Lord Jesus is coming, bearing real gifts, profoundly important gifts. He came that first Christmas to win forgiveness and give all the gifts that come with it: hope, peace, joy, love. He is coming again at the end of this world to give the gift of resurrection to eternal life. In the season of Advent, we connect Christ's first coming with his second coming. We rejoice in all the unconditional gifts he gives. Each week, more Advent candles are lighted. With growing eagerness and expectation, we look forward to the coming King!

Each Sunday in Advent we will focus on a gift from God to each of us because of the gift of Jesus.

- November 28 The Gift of Hope
- December 5 The Gift of Peace
- December 12 The Gift of Joy
- December 19 The Gift of Love



The services will be on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary. Each service will have a different focus.

(There will be no soup supper this year.)

- **December 1 - The ABCs of Advent:** A word about Advent from each letter of the alphabet as we focus on the promise of a Savior.
- **December 8 - Health and Healing Service:** Focus on healing in Christ, including prayer and optional anointing with oil.
- **December 15 - Lessons and Carols:** Led by the Sanctuary Choir. A service of Word and Song, tracing the prophecies of the Messiah through the announcement of His birth.

- 1:45 – 2:25 3rd, 4th and 5th Grade



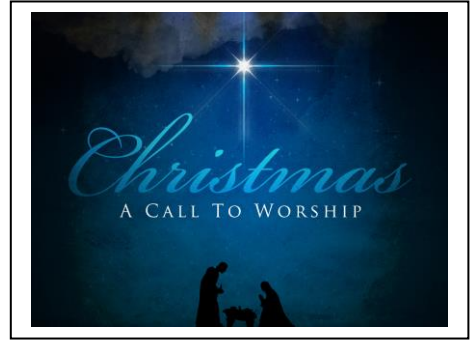
Prayer & Praise

Water Bottles for Camille Creek for Christmas!

For several years now St. John's, through the Comfort Dog Team, has supported Napa's disenfranchised students at Camille Creek Community School with presents for Christmas. These 6th-12th grade students are primarily from very low income families, and/or homeless, and/or involved in gangs, and/or have dealt with substance abuse, and/or in the court system for various reasons. Camille Creek is an extremely special place that provides stability, restorative relationships, counseling, and a chance to get their high school diploma.



This year, the school finally has a real building to call home. Up until this time they have been in disheveled portables. This building, besides new classrooms, has a shop, a culinary kitchen, and a laundry so kids can wash their own clothes.

What they still need though are water bottles. There are stations in the school where the students can fill their own personal water bottles, so the school has asked us if this Christmas our ministry can provide 125+ reusable water bottles for their students and staff.

What we hope to do is raise enough money for the Comfort Dog Team to buy the bottles, fill them with candy, and wrap them up for delivery before Christmas.

You can help by donating to the Comfort Dog Camille Creek project. **We need the funds no later than December 5th** so we have time to shop for the bottles and wrap them.

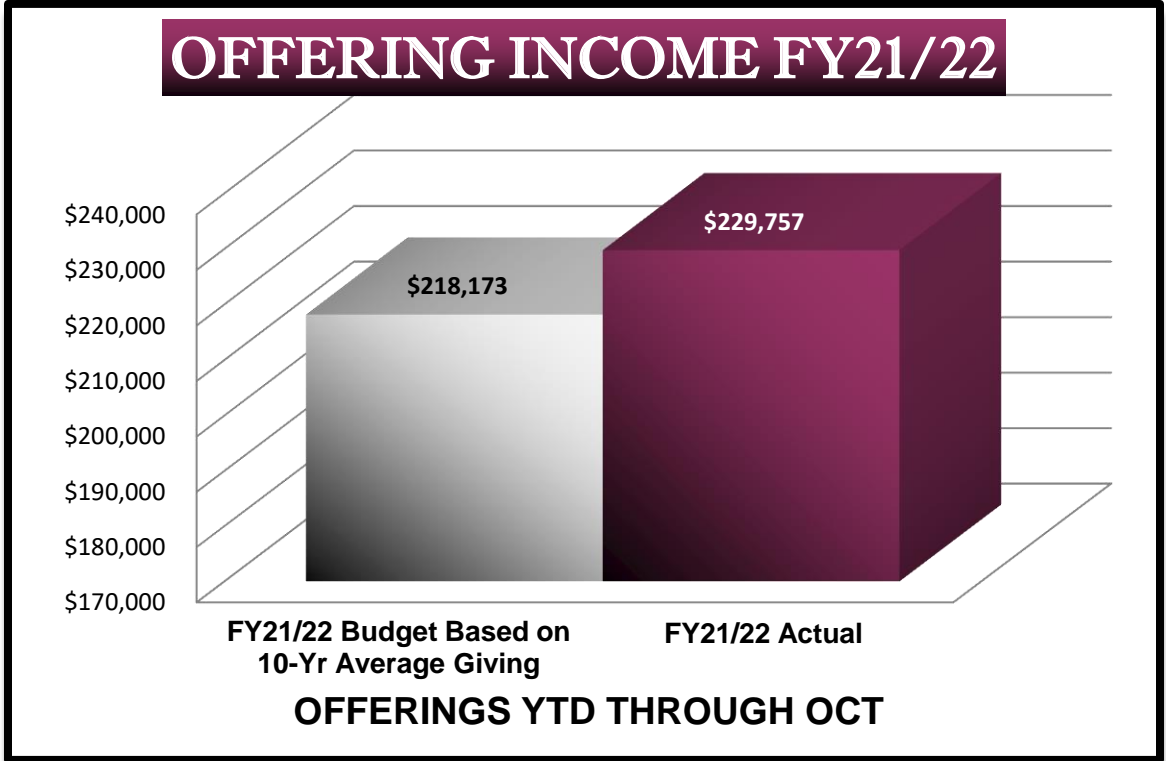
Actual Offering Income for Oct:

“But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us” (2 Corinthians 4:7)(ESV)

Who Are We, Anyway?

At this time of year, our minds are drawn to thoughts of our Savior, as they should be. The ages-old story is always fresh and exciting to us as Christians as we rejoice in our Father’s great love for us shown in His sending His own Son for us. That Son came in the form of a Baby Who was nurtured inside His mother’s body, a *“treasure in a jar of clay.”*

The angels announced His birth; the shepherds left their sheep and came to worship Him; the Wise Men traveled many miles to adore Him and bring Him their gifts. “*But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart*” (Luke 2:19). She still had “*this treasure in a jar of clay.*”

We, too, have this “*treasure . . . this all-surpassing power . . . from God and not from us.*” We have the Word dwelling in us! His great power enables and equips us to be stewards who can fulfill any task our Savior lays before us. He gives us courage to witness of His birth and life and death and resurrection. He gives us gifts to serve His people and to reach out to those still outside His kingdom. He gives us financial resources to support the mission and ministry of our churches.

During this time of Advent and Christmas, let us “*treasure . . . these things and ponder them in [our hearts].*” And let us ask God to use us according to His plan to spread the news of that treasure.

Discussion Thoughts:

1. Read 2 Corinthians 12:9-10. How do these verses relate to our theme verse, 2 Corinthians 4:7?
2. What does Matthew 13:44 say about the value of the “*treasure*”?
3. What are you doing with the “*treasure in [your] jar of clay*”?

Prayer:

Oh gracious and loving Father, thank You for the love You have shown in giving me Your Son, my greatest treasure. Give me the desire and the courage to avail myself of the great power that You have given me through Jesus. In His name I pray. Amen.

In November, Gomer and I participated in a wonderful training session at the Yuba County Superior Court in Marysville, CA. The event was organized by Team Reuben Comfort Dog and we had a great time learning about how we can assist in the court room. We were joined by Micah Comfort Dog, Rahab Comfort Dog and Lois Comfort Dog (who made the long trek all the way from Las Vegas). Our humans learned about how Yuba County is using comfort dogs in the courtroom to assist with victims when they testify. Our session was held in an actual courtroom and we heard from the district attorney, a victim's advocate representative and a counselor who deals with compassion fatigue. Reuben, Micah and I were able to share some of our experiences from our own work in court and then all the comfort dogs took turns practicing spending time with a "witness" on the witness stand. I am very excited for Rahab and Gomer to begin doing this amazing work soon.

As we begin the Advent season, Gomer and I are looking forward to some special opportunities we have to share the love and compassion of Jesus with others. We have been invited to visit cadets at the United States Coast Guard training center in Petaluma. Many of these students will be spending Christmas away from home and we hope to bring them some extra smiles and good cheer. We also have plans to participate in a modified version of "Shop with a Cop" in Napa. Additionally, we will be delivering reusable water bottles filled with Christmas candy for the staff and students at Camille Creek at their Christmas Open House. Our team has also sponsored a family connected with N.E.W.S., Napa Emergency Women's Services to make their Christmas a bit brighter. 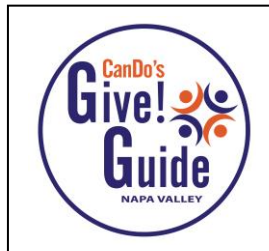


Once again, St. John's Mission Farm will be participating in CanDo Napa Valley's *Give!Guide* 2021 Campaign to raise additional funds for our mission of growing fresh produce to ease the food insecurities of many families in our city and county.

The Lord has really blessed our efforts this year. I said last month that we will easily set a new mark for the total poundage of produce turned over to the Napa County Food Bank – somewhere near 25,000 lbs. Oh, me of little faith! At the end of October we were at 26,700 lbs.! We still have November and December to go. And all those cabbages you see growing out in the field near the Parish Hall, getting close to harvesting, will really add up! And He has also blessed us with many supporting gifts from the members of the congregation this past year. Thank you. But additional gifts are encouraged and needed!

It still is important that we participate in the *Give!Guide* 2021. Not just to raise more financial support, but to gain further exposure in the community. Between the *Give!Guide* campaigns of the past, as well as a few well timed newspaper articles, more people in the community have come to recognize not only what we are doing, but why. Jesus still is in the business of feeding the multitudes, while giving His servants the pleasure of being instruments of His grace. Not only have we received many supporting gifts from the community; we have also gained some very valuable volunteers as a result.

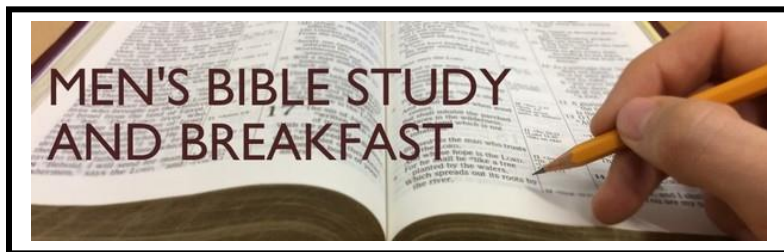
