Worship Series Better Together

Reclaiming our St. John's Community

COVID has been hard on community. This has been true for families, for friends, and for the city in which we live. It has also been hard on our congregation as a community. For months, we could not worship together, and some are still not ready to resume in-person gathering. So many activities that have been part of our normal congregational life had to be put aside in the interest of safety and health.

It's time to reclaim who we are as the community of God's people. It's time to reboot our identity as members of a church, branches on a vine, sheep of a flock, stones in a building, and parts of a body.

The worship series "Better Together" focuses on what it means to be a congregation. We will be looking at the Biblical metaphors and images for the local church, and seeking to apply these truths to our lives, both individually and as a congregation. Along the way, we will be inviting your participation in activities and events designed to bring us together as a church, so that we can rediscover the Biblical truth that, as the people of God, we are truly "better together."

Stephen Ministers are Compassionate, Full of Faith, Skilled and Trustworthy

The word **compassionate** means "to suffer along with another person."

Compassionate Stephen Ministers are willing and able to share their care receivers' feelings, and journey with them through their crisis. They are often "wounded healers" who have experienced loss or pain in life. They minister out of their personal understanding of what it's like to go through a difficult time. Stephen Ministers are passionate about this ministry.

They care deeply and personally about their care receivers. They want to bring Christ's love and care so their care receivers can experience hope and healing.



Stephen Ministers are **full of faith** as they believe in Jesus and minister in His name. They trust God to provide the courage and love they need to care for their care receivers. Stephen Ministry is one way they express their faith in, and love for, Jesus. They pray for their care receivers. They believe that God can and will bring healing and wholeness to their care receivers. They follow their care receivers' lead in knowing when and how much to share their faith. They trust the Holy Sprit to actively draw the care receiver to Christ.

Stephen Ministers are **skilled** as they study and learn the kinds of feelings and challenges people are likely to experience when going through a crisis or difficult time. They know how to use essential caregiving skills such as listening, understanding and dealing with feelings, beginning and ending care relationships, maintaining boundaries, and helping their care receivers find more appropriate care when necessary. Stephen Ministers are aware that sometimes they must refer their care receive to professional caregivers, such as pastors, counselors, or mental health professionals, to meet the care receiver's need. They know how to effectively participate in Supervision Groups.

Stephen Ministers are **trustworthy** and reliable caregivers. They know the importance of their promises to their care receivers, and they fulfill those promises. They care for their care receives for as long as their support is needed. Even in challenging moments, they remain committed to their care receivers and the caring relationship. Stephen Ministers maintain confidentiality. They don't tell others what goes on in their caring relationships, and in supervision meetings they are careful to avoid identifying their care receiver. They faithfully attend twice-monthly continuing education and supervision meetings to ensure they and their fellow Stephen Ministers provide the best care possible.



Meditation:

"But now thus says the LORD, He who created you, O Jacob, He who formed you, O Israel: 'Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.'" (Isaiah 43:1)(ESV)

God's Stewards are God's Stewards

This means that God's stewards are stewards by virtue of creation and their re-creation in Holy Baptism; therefore, they belong to the Lord.

Stewardship, from the Biblical point of view, is a matter of identity. It's about knowing the One to whom we personally belong. It's about being known by and knowing the Triune God, the God of the

Bible, the Lord and Giver of Life, the Creator and Re-Creator of all life—God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Bible teaches God made us, body and soul, for the present and for eternity for Himself, and even when we wander away from God, deny our being stewards, we still are! God has spoken in and through creation. Vitally important for our understanding of the meaning of life is God has spoken through the redeeming, re-creating, new-life-giving work of His Son; through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus the Messiah, the Savior, we are restored to new relationships with Almighty God.

The Bible teaches that it is the gracious action of God-in-Christ who accepts, forgives and makes stewards out of people who are inclined to ignore and even rebel against God. It is a grace-filled response to say, "I am God's steward!" That is a privilege to be valued highly every day of life.

As we reflect on who and Whose we are, on what God has done for us, given to us, our identity is made more sure, more firm—like a loving child learning of being adopted by loving parents. Being identified as GOD'S steward is about our mission, our purpose for living.

As we consider the Biblical basis for this principle, please reflect on the context of each one of the Bible sections or passages listed. There is much to be gained by careful and prayerful reflection on what God reveals to us in the Bible. The implications of saying, "I am God's steward" are enormous. It means we can give credit to God as the source of all gifts, talents, skills and time that we have. It means that our stewardship involves all of life and that we are discoverers, developers and deployers of all the gifts God has given to us. Our purpose is to let our life be an offering, a contribution to others in the name of Christ.

Take a close look at Gen. 1; Is. 43:1-3; Rom. 6:1-11; 2 Cor. 5:14-6:2; Eph. 2:8-10; and other references concerning God's creating and redeeming activity. Prayerfully take notes or make journal entries on your thoughts. Share them with others in a group or class and expand on the privilege of being called "God's steward." You are! We are! It is our challenge and privilege to live out that calling, that purpose in daily life. Wow! *God's stewards are God's stewards!*

Prayer: Lord, You created me to be a steward. In Holy Baptism, You made me a Christian steward. Guide me in understanding that I am a steward by Your grace and that my stewardship is a way of life. Keep me dependent on You and responsible to You. I ask this for Jesus' sake, Amen.



SO, WHAT'S NEW AT THE FARM?

The harvest at the Mission Farm has truly been God-blessed this year both in quantity and quality. As of the end of July, we have turned in 12,178.75 lbs. of produce to the Napa County Food Bank. In August we have been harvesting and sending in an estimated 1750 to 2000 lbs. of produce! It's going to be a record year.



However, the mission of the Farm isn't just about pounds. It's about people . . . people facing, for various reasons, food insecurity. We really don't know how many people our produce helps feed. We do know that historically the Food Bank has been serving about 500 families a week. We understand that as a result of Covid-19 that number increased about five or six times! That's a lot of mouths to feed! Nevertheless, our contributions, together with other community gardens contributing their surplus produce, vendors at the local Farmers' Market contributing some of what did not move on market day, grocery stores contributing foods that are close to the end of their shelf life, and finally what is available from government surplus sources – all are helping to address the problem. We are grateful to be able to do our part.

Thank you for supporting us with your prayers and with your financial support. If you are also able to give a little time helping harvest or processing the harvest, we would be blessed to have you join us. The core volunteers are out there every Monday, Wednesday, and Saturdays mornings, 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. Even contributing one morning a week would serve this ministry well!
