Connections Ministry Leader



Key responsibilities include


- Enhance our efforts to maximize all of the ways we engage in witness and outreach

Our Solar Project is still in the permitting process with the city. As soon as that is complete and a start date and schedule is announced, we will notify the congregation.



OFFERING UPDATE

Actual Offering Income for Dec: Total Offerings for FY21/22 (as of 31 Dec 21): **\$81,678. \$368,312** which is **3.61%** or **\$13,042** over our budgeted offering income.

Total expenses are in line with our budget and we paid all bills received. *The budget amount shown below is based on the ten-year average offering received for that time period.



Meditation:

"On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made." (1 Corinthians 16:2)(NIV)

What is Tithing?

A steward is a manager, a caretaker, actually a servant of another. We don't choose to be God's stewards. We are chosen by Him to be His stewards. God has given each of us time, abilities, and possessions, not to own, but to manage for Him. This is a big responsibility. We own nothing but manage everything. God gives firm direction on how we are to carry out our responsibility.

In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to tithe (Leviticus 27:30). It was the duty of His people to tithe, although many gave their gifts willingly out of love, trust, and faith in God.

- Exodus 25:1-2: "You are to receive the offering for Me from each man whose heart prompts him to give."
- ➤ Chronicles 29:3-6: "... the officials in charge of the King's work gave willingly"

 The people gave not because they were commanded to give, but because of an inward desire to give.

As New Testament Christians, we are not commanded, but we are motivated by God's grace to give generously and to use the tithe as a Biblical guide for our giving. Three giving principles are found in 1 Corinthians 16:2:

- We are to give regularly--systematically ("on the first day of every week")
- We each have a personal responsibility to give ("each one of you")
- We are to give in proportion to the income that we receive ("in keeping with your income")

Giving is not an option for Christians. Just as God gave, we are called to give. Through faith, we give out of gratitude for who God is and what He has done for us through His Son, Jesus. Because of Christ's love for us, we are compelled to give (2 Corinthians 5:14). In the Old Testament, people gave their tithes, and, for special needs, they gave offerings. As New Covenant Christians, who live under grace, we are empowered to give even more. As we grow spiritually, we will, with God's strength, aim to become tithers and even go beyond the tithe.

Prayer:

Dear Heavenly Father, forgive me when I am unwilling to return to You what is rightfully Yours. Forgive me, also, for not even acknowledging that everything I have is a gift from You. Help me to trust You and obey Your will for my giving. Thank You for fulfilling the law in my place. Through Christ Who gives me strength. Amen.

<u>tkramer@stjohnslutheran.net</u>, announcing your intent to enroll in the 2021-2022 academic year. All applications must include the following information:

- a) Your Name
- b) School Name
- c) Student ID or Account # (if returning student)
- d) Degree you are pursuing
- e) Year and Level of study (e.g. Junior year, Undergrad; 5th year, teacher certification, or student teaching; Graduate studies)
- f) Attending Fall Term or Spring Term (or both)
- g) Briefly explain why you're attending Concordia and how you plan to use your studies/future vocation to shine the light of Christ and to witness for Jesus as His kingdom representative in the world.

<u>Deadline for applications is March 31, 2022</u>. Actual grant amount to each student is undetermined but will be based, in part, upon the number of students requesting assistance. So, if you are considering attending a synodical university--<u>even if you have not made a final decision</u>-please send a brief note informing us of where you are in your decision process so that we can plan accordingly.



SO, WHAT'S NEW AT THE FARM?

I have a couple of "totals" for you that may be of interest.



First, the total amount of fresh produce raised on the Mission Farm and turned into the Napa Food Bank during 2021 - 28,976.5 lbs. Far and away greater than any other year in our service history! God is good!

Second, the total amount raised for our ministry through our participation in the *CanDo Give!Guide 2021* campaign -- \$4,299.67. Some of this support came from our own members; yet the larger portion came from people in the community who are pleased to support our efforts with their donations. God's people reflect His generosity!

Third, I wish I could tell you how many volunteer hours were donated this year to wrestle in all those crops. Actually, I could, if I were willing to put in the time. We keep a log, with the names of those who worked on any particular day and the nature of their service. But it would take a whole lot of rainy days keeping one out of the fields to tempt us to total up all the hours to combat stir-craziness. Suffice it to say that God's people who volunteer to serve on the Farm have been very generous with their time and energy!

January has definitely been a period of flexibility for St. Joh's Lutheran School. We are so blessed at SJL that our faculty and staff are able to adapt to the ever changing dynamics of their classroom, and to the students and their families who care so much about



our community that they follow the protocols that are in place for the safety of all.


