Friendship is a blessing and I am truly grateful for the many friends I have met during my time at St. John's. This past month I celebrated graduations with some of my old friends. I also had a blast meeting and spending time with some new friends at Vacation Bible School at St. John's and the CNH Jr. High Youth Gathering in Rocklin, CA.

Later this month will mark the one-year anniversary of the commissioning of another dear friend of mine, my "co-worker", Gomer Comfort Dog. I am so grateful to have another paw partner on my team and it has been a great pleasure to work alongside her, showing her the ropes. In the past year, she has gotten to meet some of my friends while visiting Vintage High School, Brookdale Senior Living, and Collabria Adult Day Services. (At Collabria, Gomer made a new friend with an old friend from St. John's who acted as translator during her visits with Spanish speaking participants.) Gomer and I have also been able to work together at many of the fire base camps, as well as visits to Las Vegas, 9/11 commemorations in Napa and Yountville, the Coast Guard Training Center, and the PUC elementary school. We have deployed together to a Yellow Ribbon event in Boise, ID and worked alongside each other at the Best Practices in Ministry in Phoenix, AZ. During her time here, Gomer has worked with all the other comfort dogs in our region, spending time at Nellis Air Force base in Las Vegas, NV, attending the services of a fallen police officer in Elk Grove, CA and attending regional gatherings and special training for working in court. Additionally, she has made some friends at the St. John's Mission Farm and Men's Bible Study, as well as friends from around the country via Zoom virtual visits. We praise God for all the work He is doing with us and through us.



#### Stephen Ministry – Did you know...

77 percent of people experience stress that affects their physical health. Regardless of age, sex, ethnicity, and religion, no one is immune to the burdens of stress.



An estimated 31.1% of U.S. adults experience anxiety at some time in their lives.

Depression affects approximately 17.3 million American adults, or about 7.1% of the U.S. population age 18 and older, each year.

There are common causes of grief, including: Death of a loved one, Divorce, Loss of a Job, or Death of a pet.

More than one-third of adults aged 45 and older feel lonely, and nearly one-fourth of adults aged 65 and older are considered to be socially isolated.

In the first year of the COVID-19 pandemic, global prevalence of anxiety and depression increased by a massive 25%, according to a scientific brief released by the World Health Organization (WHO).

God never intended for us to go through these experiences alone. That's why God has brought us together as a congregation, and why we have Stephen Ministry.

Stephen Ministers are members of our congregation who are trained caregivers, to minister to people experiencing a crisis, facing a challenge, or simply going through a tough time. They are prayerfully matched with people who are going through a stressful time or life difficulty.

A Stephen Minister will meet with you on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, provide emotional and spiritual support, and remind you of Christ's presence in your life. The care you'll receive is confidential, free, and very helpful.

Oh, dear me! "Farmer Ted" has been AWOL for nearly six months. Partly because other responsibilities kept me away from the Farm, and I had lost touch with what was going on. But I am trading in my saw and hammer and paint brushes to take up my word processor again.



Wow! What a difference a few weeks makes. When I returned to the Farm, the soil had been prepared, and the seed plants had been started. But now they are in the ground: cucumbers, bell peppers, jalapeno peppers, eggplant, tomatoes, melons, zucchini squash, etc. Now corn has been planted from seed, and winter squash as well. Already some harvest is underway as we are picking the first of the zucchini, peppers, and cucumbers, and have dug up the onions and garlic we planted during the cool season. So things are getting very busy now on our three acres!

Volunteer farmers are in high demand. We have the core workers out there every Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday mornings, 8:30 to 12 noon. If you have a day to spare, a love of gardening, or a compassion for families facing grocery insecurity, we would be happy to have you join us. Even if you don't know a cucumber from a zucchini, or a hula hoe from a garden fork, or a weed from a valuable food crop (hint, weeds don't grow in a straight line!), we will teach.

Hope to see you. Even if you can't volunteer, please pray for the workers and the crops. A supporting gift would be welcome too!
