Let's Join Jesus on His Mission!

It was great having Rev. Greg Finke of *Dwelling 1:14* with us on May 14-15 to lead a workshop, as well as preach and teach on Sunday morning. But we're not finished with him yet! A key component of our proposed ministry plan for the coming year is seeking to incorporate the teachings from this past weekend.

At the workshop, Rev. Finke outlined five mission practices to incorporate in everyday life

- **Seeking the Kingdom** - Look for the good the Father has prepared in advance for me to do. (Matthew 6:33, John 4:35, Ephesians 2:8-10)
- **Hearing from Jesus** - Reading the gospels, what is Jesus giving me to believe and do for the good of others? (John 6:63, John 13:17)
- **Talking with People** - What's their name? What's their story? What's Jesus up to in their life? (John 4:7)
- **Doing Good** - How can I be a way something good happens in their day? When they experience love and service through me, they are experiencing the love and service of Jesus. I am the body of Christ. (Ephesians 2:10, Matthew 10:8)
- **Ministering through Prayer** - Pray for people daily and with people as God gives opportunity. (Philippians 4:6) Use a neighborhood prayer map (see <https://blesseveryhome.com/>) to help you be consistent with prayer.

There will be monthly "Navigation Zoom" meeting with Rev. Finke that will be open to all. Watch the E-Vine for the time and the link to join in. These are opportunities to encourage one another and also for Rev. Finke to share more insights in joining Jesus on His mission.

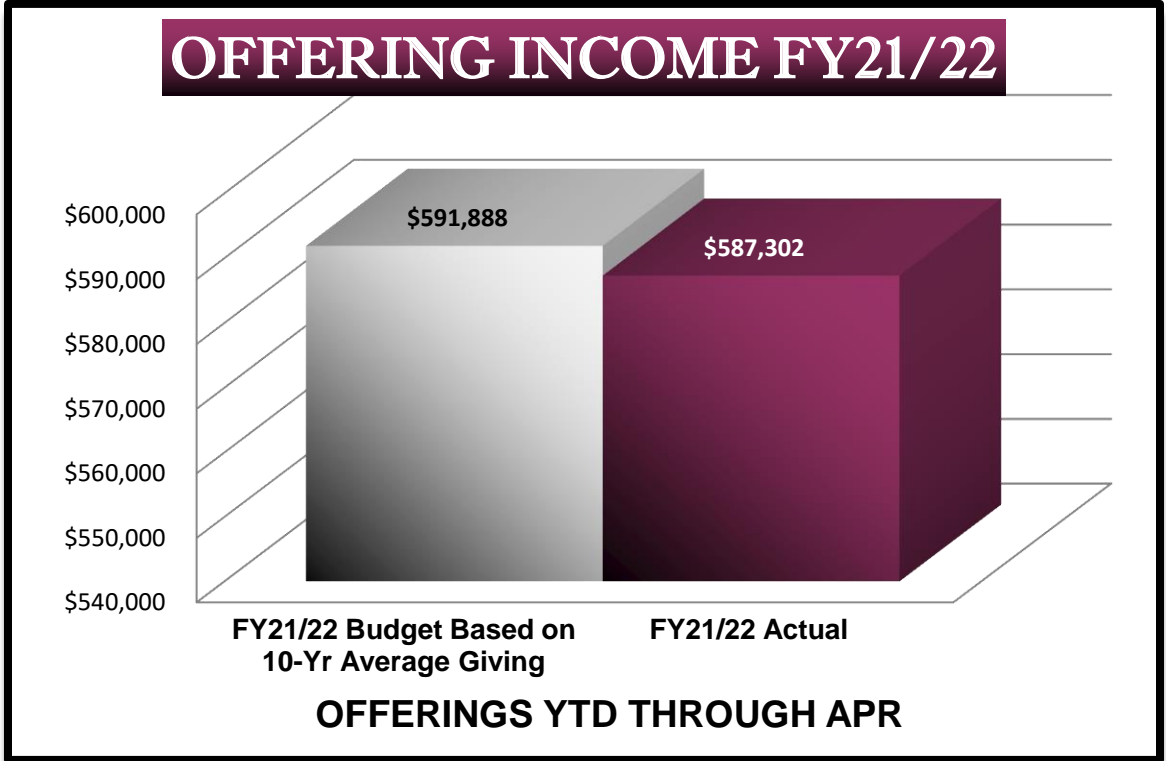
Actual Offering Income for Apr:

“If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches?” (Luke 16:11)(ESV)

Money and the Great Commission

Jesus’ parting command was: *“Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.”* (Matthew 28:19-20). Jesus was very direct and explicit with His mandate. There is no question as to where or with whom we are to share the Gospel. The love that God gives to us is to be shared by us with all people everywhere.

He has given us our marching orders, and, in His strength, we can give ourselves fully to His work.

Because God has chosen to use us as His tools to bring salvation to all people, we must use our lives and gifts to spread the Good News. Paul wrote, “*We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us*” (2 Corinthians 5:20). One of the tools that God gives us to use in our mission of reaching out to others with the Gospel is our money. According to an old stewardship phrase, “Stewardship without mission is unnecessary and mission without stewardship is impossible.” Stewardship and mission are inseparable. The funding of the Great Commission needs to come from believers. The money which God entrusts to us has many purposes, and the funding of mission work is of first importance. Through the giving of our money, we demonstrate our obedience to Jesus’ command to reach out to all people. Paul wrote that, through our giving, we “*test the sincerity of [our] love by comparing it with the earnestness of others*” (2 Corinthians 8:8).

For nonbelievers and those who lack spiritual maturity, the giving of money is done begrudgingly out of a sense of obligation. By the grace of God, our attitude toward giving is a “want to” rather than a “got to” give. We view giving as a privilege and an opportunity to spread the Gospel through our money. Our giving expresses our gratitude for who God is and all that He has done for through His Son. Through faith, we hold onto our money loosely and then are privileged to experience the joy of giving as we give God our first and best. As Christians we understand that God has a claim on all that we have, so we willingly and cheerfully give our money to help all people hear of God’s love. Money is an important tool for God’s mission. Through our faithful giving, we are able to leverage our witnessing to all people.

Prayer:

Dear Lord, You are so generous with me. Grant me a faithful and giving heart so I can be generous with You. Help me to hold onto my things loosely. Empower me, Lord, to use my time, talents, and treasures in Your service. In Your precious name I pray. Amen.

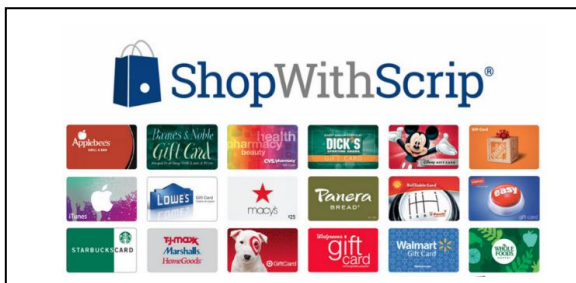
God never intended for us to go through these experiences alone. That's why God has brought us together as a congregation, and why we have Stephen Ministry.

Stephen Ministers are members of our congregation who have received caregiving training to minister to people experiencing a crisis, facing a challenge, or simply going through a tough time. They are prayerfully matched with people who are going through a stressful time or life difficulty.

A Stephen Minister will meet with you on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, provide emotional and spiritual support, and remind you of Christ's presence in your life. The care you'll receive is confidential, free, and very helpful.

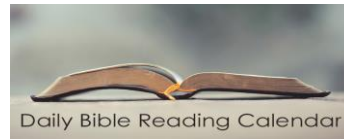

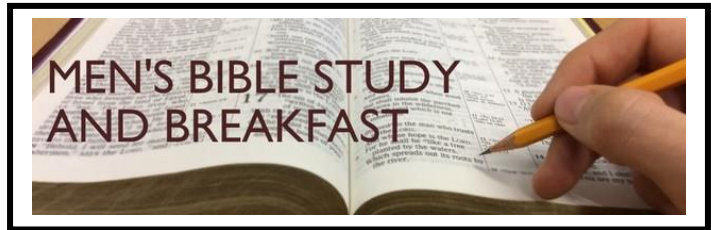


The Give+ Mobile App from VANCO shut down 1 Oct 21 and will no longer be available for download as a mobile app. The new app is called **VANCO Mobile**.
