The Zoom session will last between 40-45 minutes.



Actual Offering Income for Jun: Total Offerings for FY21/22 (as of 30 Jun 22): \$45,602. \$681,473 which is 2.65% or \$18,527 below our budgeted offering income.

Meditation:

"By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts...And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who seek Him." (Hebrews 11:4, 6)(ESV)

The Gifts of Cain and Abel

It's the attitude of our hearts and minds toward God that matters most to Him.

The first gifts that we read about in Scripture are the offerings made by Cain and Abel who were the sons of Adam and Eve. In Genesis 4:2-4 we read, ". . . Now Abel kept flocks and Cain worked the soil. In the course of time Cain brought some of the fruits of the soil as an offering to

the Lord. But Abel brought fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock." Cain and Abel, having been instructed by Adam in the knowledge of the Lord, brought offerings or gifts for the Lord. Because one worked the land and the other raised animals, their gifts were different. We read that Cain "brought some of the fruits of the soil as an offering," whereas Abel "brought fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock."

Between the two brothers there is also an indication of a difference in the attitudes of their hearts. While Cain wasn't concerned about giving the first or best of his crop, Abel brought in his best. God looked with favor upon Abel's offering. God looked into the hearts of both Cain and Abel as He looks into our hearts. He saw Abel's humble faith. In his gift, Abel showed his sincere gratitude for all that God had done for Him.

We need to understand that it's not the size of our gifts and offerings which makes them acceptable to the Lord, but rather it is the attitude of our hearts and minds toward God. God wants our gifts to be an expression of our love for Him. He wants us to give cheerfully rather than grudgingly. He wants us to give out love through faith. We are told by the writer in Hebrews that without faith it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6).

May this story of giving by Cain and Abel help us to examine our attitude toward giving. If we are not giving our first and best out of faith and love to the Lord, God does not look with favor upon our giving. May God grant us all faithful, loving, and giving hearts.

Prayer:

Dear Lord, I am a sinner. The attitude of my heart is not pure, it is not often focused on You but rather towards myself. The gifts that I sometimes give, I give grudgingly and often without thought or consideration of Your love. Forgive me for being weak in my faith. Grant me a faithful, loving and giving heart. Lead me to joyously look to Jesus, "the perfector of our faith," for the inspiration and motivation to give generously and cheerfully. In Your precious name I pray. Amen.



Stephen Ministry -- Keeping Confidences

"Reckless words pierce like a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing."

Proverbs 12:18



Confidentiality is a cornerstone of Stephen Ministry. It gives care receivers the reassurance they need so that they can risk revealing to their Stephen Ministers their deepest thoughts and feelings, details they might not be able to discuss with anyone else. It is through the sharing of innermost feelings that God can work the miracle of healing, restoring faith and hope to care receivers' lives. Without the assurance of confidentiality, most care receivers would have a difficult time opening up, which would impede the healing process.

Think about the importance of confidentiality in your day-to-day relationships. When someone shares a personal feeling, a thought that is troubling him or her, or something for which he or she might feel guilty, it might be tempting to pass along that information. Even when motives are noble (for instance, wanting to pass the information along as a prayer request), it could be damaging or painful to the person who first shared the information.

If you really believe it is something that needs to be passed along – to a prayer group, pastor, Stephen Leader, or someone else who could help – tell that to the person who shared it. Explain why you believe others should know and encourage him or her to pass it along to the appropriate person(s). Or get permission from the individual for you to share the information yourself.

Confidentiality is a standard of conduct all of us need to live by – not just those involved in our Stephen Ministry. Confidentiality promotes trust, builds one another up, and encourages healing in a Christian community.

A Stephen Minister is ready to meet with you on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, provide emotional and spiritual support, and remind you of Christ's presence in your life. The care you'll receive is confidential, free, and very helpful.


