## **Advent Sunday Worship Series 2022**

### **Why He Came**

Our Advent Series this year leads us to take a step back and look at the big picture of what we will celebrate at Christmas. Why did Jesus come? It was more than showing us the love of God. It was more than living as an example. It was more than the forgiveness of our sins. It was nothing less than bringing about a new creation, free from sin and all its corruption.

Each week of Advent, using the readings from the prophet Isaiah, we'll look at one of the aspects of the New Creation that Christ has won for us. We prepare to celebrate His coming by celebrating the blessings that will be ours in eternity because of His coming.

#### **November 27**

### **Advent1: Peace**

We need peace. Our world is in need of peace. International tension. Domestic political and cultural animosity. Even conflicts between and within families. Not to mention the lack of peace within as a result of all of this. Jesus came to bring peace. Because of His coming, we live with the hope of a new creation in which there will be perfect peace. As citizens now of this new creation, we strive to be agents of peace in our lives.

### **Advent 2: Justice**

We need justice. Our world is in need of justice. So much corruption, deception, unfairness. Too many taken advantage of and denied what should be theirs. Biblical justice refers not only to fairness in law, but also that people are able to live the lives that God intends them to live. Jesus came to bring justice. ### **Advent 3: Healing**

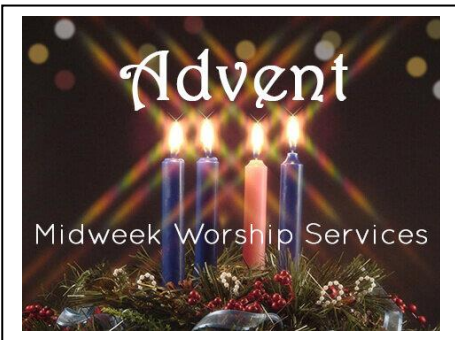

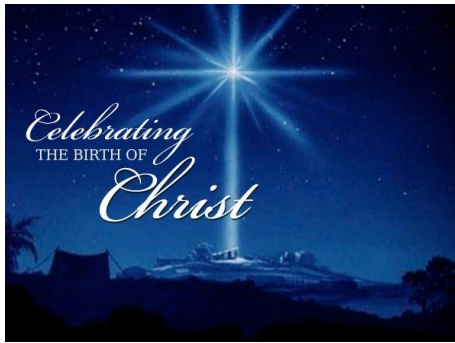

During the season of Advent, we will also offer worship services on Wednesday evenings at 7:00. Each of the four services are unique with a different focus and style. Each service will also be preceded by a soup supper in the Parish Hall starting at 6:00 PM.

PLEASE NOTE: These services will NOT be streamed live. They may be recorded for later uploading to our YouTube channel.

- **November 30 - Health and Healing Service:** Focus on healing in Christ, including prayer and optional anointing with oil.
- **December 7 - The ABCs of Christmas:** A name or title of Jesus from each letter of the alphabet as we focus on the birth of our Savior.
- **December 14 - Lessons and Carols:** Led by the Sanctuary Choir. A service of Word and Song, tracing the prophecies of the Messiah through the announcement of His birth.
- **December 21 – The Hymns of Christmas** – We will countdown your favorite Christmas hymns to sing, along with a brief devotion on each one about the hymn's background and message. Watch for an upcoming survey to indicate your favorites!

- **Christmas Eve, 4:00 PM** – Children and Family Service, including a birthday cake for Jesus!

- **Christmas Day, 9:30 AM** – In Person in the Sanctuary, Communion

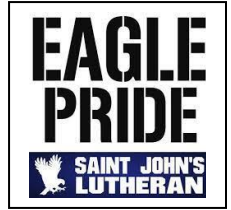

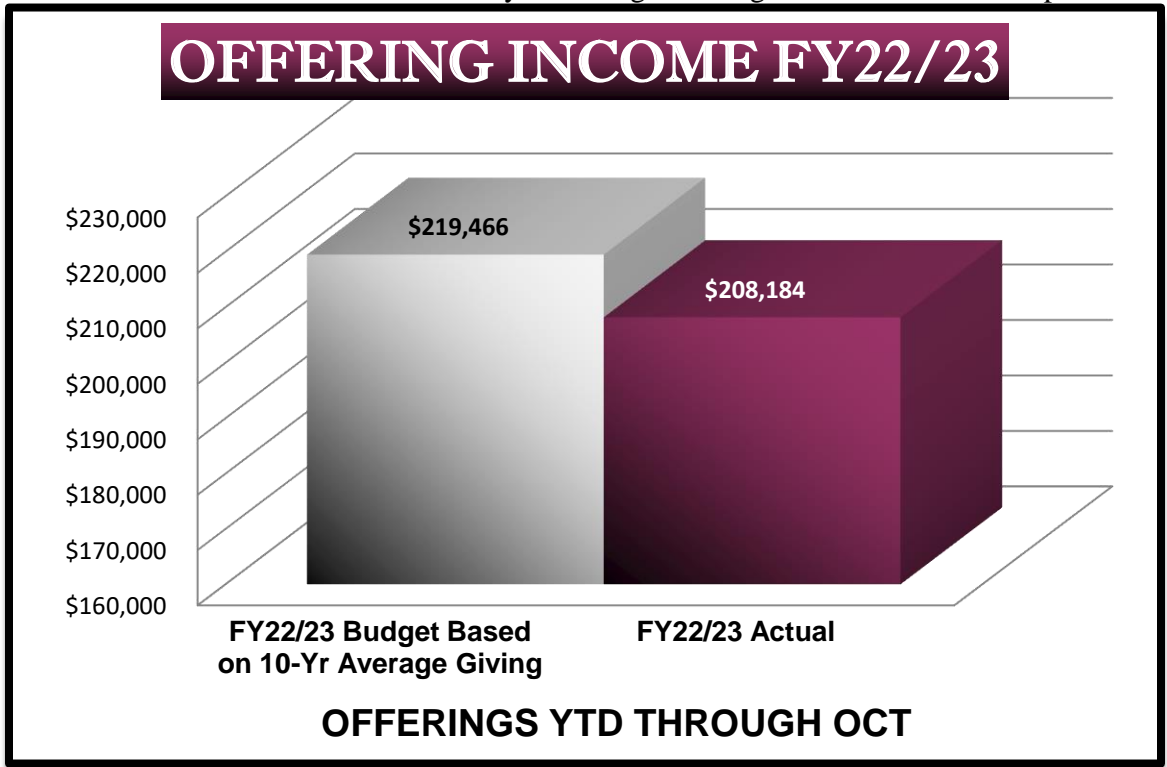
Actual Offering Income for Oct:

*“But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us.” (2 Corinthians 4:7)(ESV)*

### Who Are We, Anyway?

At this time of year, our minds are drawn to thoughts of our Savior, as they should be. The ages-old story is always fresh and exciting to us as Christians as we rejoice in our Father’s great love for us shown in His sending His own Son for us. That Son came in the form of a Baby Who was nurtured inside His mother’s body, a *“treasure in a jar of clay.”*

The angels announced His birth; the shepherds left their sheep and came to worship Him; the Wise Men traveled many miles to adore Him and bring Him their gifts. “*But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart*” (Luke 2:19). She still had “*this treasure in a jar of clay.*”

We, too, have this “*treasure . . . this all-surpassing power . . . from God and not from us.*” We have the Word dwelling in us! His great power enables and equips us to be stewards who can fulfill any task our Savior lays before us. He gives us courage to witness of His birth and life and death and resurrection. He gives us gifts to serve His people and to reach out to those still outside His kingdom. He gives us financial resources to support the mission and ministry of our churches.

During this time of Advent and Christmas, let us “*treasure . . . these things and ponder them in [our hearts].*” And let us ask God to use us according to His plan to spread the news of that treasure.

### **Discussion Thoughts:**

1. Read 2 Corinthians 12:9-10. How do these verses relate to our theme verse, 2 Corinthians 4:7?
2. What does Matthew 13:44 say about the value of the “*treasure*”?
3. What are you doing with the “*treasure in [your] jar of clay*”?

### **Prayer:**

Oh gracious and loving Father, thank You for the love You have shown in giving me Your Son, my greatest treasure. Give me the desire and the courage to avail myself of the great power that You have given me through Jesus. In His name I pray. Amen.

## *Stephen Ministry: Joy*



*“I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy...”*

*Philippians 1:3-4*

Such loving, joyful words from Paul in his letter to the Philippians! These words are also heartfelt by our Stephen Ministers as they pray for their care receivers and for each other. Stephen Ministers rejoice in being able to serve others. A common feeling among them is they want to do more, serve more, bring more joy and comfort to hurting people, as they share Christ’s care and love so people can experience hope and healing.

Stephen Ministers are **compassionate**. They are willing and able to share their care receivers’ feelings, and journey with them through their crisis. They often minister out of their personal understanding of what it’s like to go through a difficult time. Stephen Ministers are passionate about this ministry. They care deeply and personally about their care receivers.

Stephen Ministers are **full of faith** as minister in Jesus’ name. They trust God to provide the courage and love they need to care for their care receivers. They believe that God can and will bring healing and wholeness to their care receivers. They follow their care receivers’ lead in knowing when and how much to share their faith. They trust the Holy Spirit to actively draw the care receiver to Christ.

Stephen Ministers are **skilled** with essential caregiving skills such as listening, understanding and dealing with feelings, beginning and ending care relationships, maintaining boundaries, and helping their care receivers find more appropriate care when necessary. Stephen Ministers are aware that sometimes they must refer their care receiver to professional caregivers, such as pastors, counselors, or mental health professionals, to meet the care receiver’s need.

Stephen Ministers are **trustworthy** and reliable caregivers. Even in challenging moments, they remain committed to their care receivers and the caring relationship. They maintain confidentiality and are careful to avoid identifying their care receiver. They faithfully attend twice-monthly continuing education and supervision meetings to ensure they and their fellow Stephen Ministers provide the best care possible.

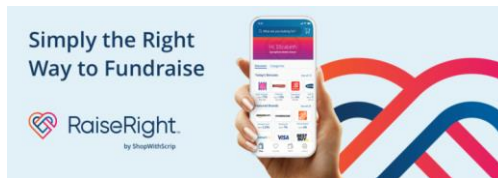

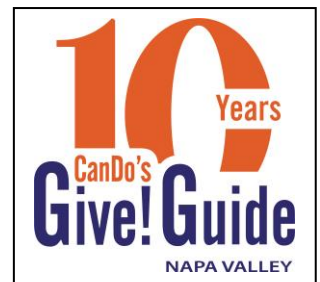
Update on the harvest of blessings for hungry families in Napa County: 3,130.5 lbs. of fresh produce during October: 20,497 lbs. for the year! God is good.



A major fund raiser for the Mission Farm each year is participation in the Napa Valley CanDo Give!Guide campaign. This year's campaign kicks off on November 29, and runs through the month of December. The Mission Farm will be one of 72 nonprofits featured that serve the community, seeking to make life for all residents a bit more friendly, safe, and healthy. Our Mission Farm, of course, seeks to address a need, even in this agricultural community, to alleviate the food anxiety many families face each year.

The CanDo Give!Guide campaign in December makes it exceptionally easy for people to support us and the other nonprofit organizations participating. Click on the campaign website, [CanDoGiveGuide.org](http://CanDoGiveGuide.org) and explore the catalogue of participating organizations describing their mission in some detail. You will be surprised by the many services provided to people of the county by these organizations. Then you can conveniently make a donation(s) on line to one or as many organizations as you choose, for as little as \$10 for each. Receipt of your gift will be recognized both by the Give!Guide campaign, and by the organization(s) you support, providing evidence of the amount and tax deductibility of your donation. Your donation can be made by credit card, or you may choose to honor your commitment by sending in a check. The latter assures that the organization receives the full amount of your donation, with no credit card company service charge deducted.

A good number of our church members support us throughout the year with financial donations, as well as donations of time and energy, as they are able. You can continue to make your financial donations any time of year by sending in to the church office or placing in the offering plate a check made out to the church, but earmarked for the Mission Farm. Or you can make your donation online in December through the Give!Guide campaign, if you choose.
