SO, WHAT'S NEW AT THE FARM?

"And on the seventh day God finished His work He had done (in creation), and He rested on the seventh day from all the work He had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy." (Gen. 2:2-3a)



Well, who could blame Him for being tired! He accomplished creating a whole universe in those preceding six days! Yet the Bible tells us that "the Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary" (Is, 40:28). He rested on the seventh day, not because He was weary; but because He knows that His creatures do. He is setting a pattern for them. Indeed, He is the Source of Strength all who require it. "He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no strength He increases strength." (vs. 29)

Well, it's Sabbath time out on the Mission Farm. This year we raised 22,000 lbs. of produce for the Napa Valley Food Bank for those challenged to feed their families! We have good reason to feel deep sense of satisfaction, like God as He looked over His Creation while He rested. We also have good reason to be bone-weary. Even Mr. Kubota needs a rest and time for maintenance service so he's ready to work the soil next spring. Even the ground needs a rest. It has been prepared and sown with cover crop to help put nutrients back into the ground that have been exhausted by the growth of the previous crops. So when you look out at the Farm the next few months, you won't see as much activity. Oh, some will be planning the crop plan, some will be ordering seed and purchasing irrigation supplies, some will be giving the trees of the orchard a haircut, some will be sharpening the tools, some have been busy seeking a different harvest, a harvest of dollars to help cover the expenses. But all will have a good chance for their bodies to catch up with their spirits (if you get my drift)!

Speaking of the harvest of dollars, how did we do in our participation in the CanDo's GiveGuide 2022 campaign and our own in-house appeal? I wish I could give you a report, but the deadline for submitting this article comes before all is accounted for. I will have to get the word out via the weekly E-Vine. But I am confident that in the Lord's economy of grace, we will be able to take satisfaction and rest comfortably, knowing that He will have provided in various ways all that we needed (in dollars, energy, nutrients) for the coming crop year!



"And Jesus said to him, 'You go, and do likewise." (Luke 10:37)(ESV)

What Is Mine Is Yours

Scripture is filled with wonderful and moving stories about sharing. Possibly the most quoted story is the Parable of the Good Samaritan. God used a despised Samaritan to encourage us to share our time, talents, and treasures with those in need. The Samaritan showed us what it means to have compassion on someone and to give sacrificially as he tended to the man beaten by the robbers. Not only did the Samaritan provide immediate aid, he brought the injured person to an inn where he could be cared for further. The Samaritan used his own funds for the man's care. The Samaritan demonstrated the attitude,

"What is mine is yours." Our challenge as Christians is to show our compassion as willingly and generously as the Good Samaritan. God wants us to be His channels of His love and care to those in need.

In contrast to the Samaritan, the priest and Levite, who passed by the victim before the Samaritan came along, showed no compassion for the beaten person. They had the attitude, "What is mine is mine." They didn't want to give any time, care, or comfort to the victim.

God has blessed us with many talents, gifts, and resources. Because God has blessed us, He will give us opportunities to use what He has given us for His purposes. Through faith, we receive God's wisdom to acknowledge that He is the provider of all things so we become more willing to share our blessings with others. When God shows you a need, are you ready to respond?

Discussion Thoughts:

- 1. Why was it so significant that the person sharing his gifts was a Samaritan?
- 2. In what ways have you demonstrated the attitude "What is mine is yours" at home, at work, and at church?
- 3. What are some other examples in Scripture where people have shared so freely?

Prayer:

Dear good and gracious Heavenly Father, You show Your love for me in so many different ways. Forgive me when I fail to thank You for all that You do for me. I thank You for Your constant presence in my life. I pray that You will grant me a loving heart that will be willing to respond to those in need. Help me to love my neighbors. In Your precious name I pray. Amen.
