- March 26 – Jesus and Martha, the sister of Lazarus

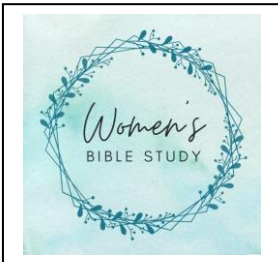
Sunday Bible Classes

St. John's Lutheran School Now Hiring Preschool Teacher's Aide



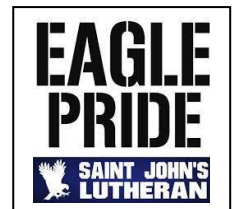
St. John's Lutheran Preschool is looking to hire a teacher's aide who is hardworking, nurturing, educated, experienced, is creative, a team player, and loves children.

SO, WHAT'S NEW AT THE FARM?

While winter is a quieter time at the Farm, and that is much appreciated by the volunteers, that doesn't mean that there aren't tasks that are still being tended. Tools have been sharpened and a new organization system has been created for their storage. The processing table has been leveled and renovated with a new working surface. Wood chips have been scattered by tractor and raked by volunteers to aid in weed control. Some noxious weeds have been removed to keep them from seeding and spreading, and we have rescued the garlic plants from the tall grasses. Soon the fruit trees will have their trunks repainted to prevent sunburn. Even though they grow their own "floppy hats" to protect themselves from the sun, they are vulnerable to sunburn until the foliage fully emerges. Very shortly the cover crop will be mown, rototilled into the soil, in preparation for future planting. So, then, there is more going on than might first appear.

There is a new wrinkle to the Mission Farm program this year which already began in mid-February. The Day School and the Farm are collaborating in order to give the young people a chance to get more involved in serving others through the Farm's Mission, and to learn more about food production, and perchance to fall in love with gardening. Every Wednesday a small group of students will join the volunteers at the Farm in some specific Farm project. Some of the first of them coming out will help plant seeds in soil pots to produce seedlings for future transplanting. This is far more cost-efficient than getting seedlings from the nurseries. It also helps us get an earlier start in food production, to have young plants in the ground soon after the fear of frost passes (usually mid-April). We are able to harvest as much as two weeks earlier this way.

When planting and transplanting time arrives, we will need many helping hands. Watch for calls for Farm Work Days. Otherwise, you are welcome to join us any Monday, Wednesday and Saturday mornings from 9 to 11:30.

Youth ministry at St. John's has been flowing well so far in this new year! March will include much of the same as far as events go with Surge & Confirmation. Surge will be meeting on Tuesday the 7th, 14th, & 28th from 6-7:30pm. Confirmation will look a bit different during Lent due to the midweek services, but we will worship together and gather for small group time each Wednesday as well!

OFFERING UPDATE

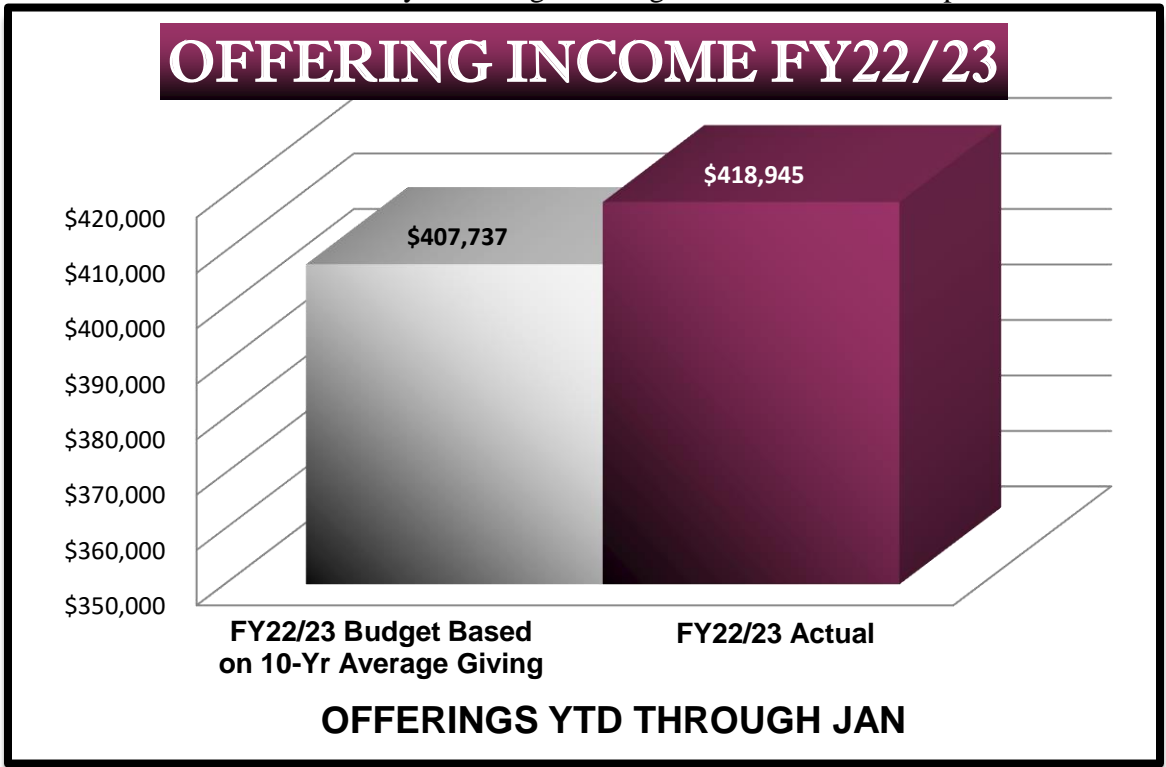
Actual Offering Income for Jan:

Meditation:

"Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house. And thereby put Me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need. I will rebuke the devourer for you, so that it will not destroy the fruits of your soil, and your vine in the field shall not fail to bear, says the LORD of hosts. Then all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a land of delight, says the LORD of hosts." (Malachi 3:10-12)(ESV)

God Blesses Us for our Giving

By faith, we understand that the best investment we can make with our money is investing or giving it to God. Throughout Scripture, when a command to give is stated, along with that command is a reference to the blessings that the giver will enjoy. These blessings come in many forms. For

example, in Proverbs 11:25, *"A generous man will prosper; he who refreshes others will himself be refreshed."* In Proverbs 19:17 Solomon tells us: *"He who is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and [God] will reward him for what he has done."* God has ordained that, when we give generously, we receive generously.

As Christians, we should give without expectation of receiving anything in return. However, our gracious God, Who loves us so much, thrills to bless us. He has put within us the joy of giving and finding reward in another's pleasure.

Through Malachi, the Lord offers a double blessing to those who will be obedient in bringing their tithes to the temple. He promises to reward them materially through plentiful harvests. He promises that, if they will honor Him with their tithes, He will prosper them beyond their dreams. Their crops will produce abundantly, and none of their fruit will spoil on the vine. The second part of the blessing is that surrounding nations will see this and realize the special protection that God gives them. *"Test Me in this,"* God said. Are you willing to test God with your earnings? Are you willing to bring your tithes to your church before you pay your bills? Are you worried about the mortgage, the clothes, the groceries, and the transportation? Jesus said, *" . . . do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear . . . your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well"* (Matthew 6:25, 32-33).



Test Him! *"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly and whoever sows generously will also reap generously"* (2 Corinthians 9:6). Are you willing to sow generously? You are free to sow generously and then to receive God's promise that you will also reap generously. *"Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you"* (Luke 6:38). It is inevitable that, when you give, you will receive, for that is the way our giving heavenly Father has planned it.

"Be careful not to do your acts of righteousness before men, to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven. So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do . . . to be honored by men. I tell you the truth, they have received their reward in full" (Matthew 6:1-2). God pours out spiritual blessings on us when we least expect them. When you are giving out of a desire to obey God's command and to help others, you will find blessings heaped up and running over. These are blessings not understood by those outside the faith.

Prayer:

Lord, You are the provider and controller of all things. Help me to put my trust and faith in You rather than in worldly things. I thank You for Your wonderful love that was shown through Your Son, Jesus, and all Your wonderful blessings You show to me every day. In Your precious name, I pray. Amen.

February was a very busy month for St. John's Lutheran School.

We started off the month celebrating World Cancer Day. Our students donated over \$1000 to the Queen of the Valley Cancer Wellness Program. This program offers a personalized exercise plan, nutritional and stress mastery counseling, and psycho-social and spiritual support at no charge to all cancer patients who reside in the Napa Valley, regardless of where they are treated, and for all cancer patients treated at the Queen, regardless of where they live. This program is fully funded through generous community support.



The biggest highlight for February was the Lutheran Elementary School Tournament at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington. LEST is a long held tradition here at SJL and we are excited that 67 students competed in **Academics** (Chess; Cubing; Knowledge Bowl – 2nd Place; Mathematics Competition- 2nd Place Team, Grade 5 – 3^d Place Individual, Grade 6- 3rd Place Individual, Grade 7- 22nd Place Individual, Grade 8- 2nd Place Individual; Robotics Competition - 2nd Place Boys and 4th place Girls; Science Competition – 1st Place; Spelling Bee Grade 5- 2nd Place; Writing Grade 8 – 1st Place Poem, Grade 6- 1st Place Short Story, Grade 5 – 2nd Place Short Story), **Athletics** (Girls Basketball - won exhibition game; Boys Basketball - 2nd Place; Cheer and Dance – 1st Place Dance AND 1st Place Cheer; Swimming – 1st Place Top points Girls Grades 5/6, Top points Girls Grades 7/8, Top points Boys Grades 7/8) and **Fine Arts** (Art one Blue Ribbon, six Red Ribbons, eight White Ribbons; Choral - Blue Ribbon; Dramatic Interruption 1st Place; Handbells - Blue Ribbon; Piano six Blue Ribbons; Original Oration 1st Place; 5th/6th Reader's Theatre – 1st Place, 7th/8th Reader's Theatre – 1st Place; Vocal Solo - six Blue Ribbons; Vocal Ensembles - three Blue Ribbons). 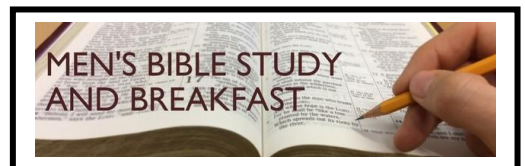
It was such an exciting time for our students to interact with other Lutheran students from schools all over the Northwest (Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and California).

Stephen Ministry: Asking for Help

Matthew 11:28



When Do We Need God’s Love Most? Of course, we need that love every second of our lives, but at times God’s love is especially precious to us, such as when:

- we lose a loved one
- life becomes so confusing that we do not know where to turn
- we are dealing with an illness, or caring for a loved one who is ill
- or life just becomes meaningless, and depression sets in

At times like these, it is especially important to have someone who cares. Our congregation has seven trained Stephen Ministers who offer a ministry of Christian caring for those in need.

Suffering on our own is not God’s intent for us. In Genesis we read that God didn’t want the man to be alone *“It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him”* (Genesis 2:18). The New Testament underscores this theme with more than 50 verses that contain the words “one another” with admonitions such as *“love one another,” “encourage one another,” “build up one another,”* and *“pray for one another.”* Love, encourage, build up, and pray for each other.

Our Stephen Ministers know about receiving care. Many of them have received care themselves at some point in their lives – something that has motivated them to provide care now. They know how difficult it is to ask for help, but they also know the great personal and spiritual growth and healing that follow. They know how to respond in a loving, caring, and nonjudgmental manner. They are equipped, ready, and waiting to provide the comfort and care God very much desires you to have.

If you, or someone you know, is facing difficulties in life you are not alone. Take the courageous step of seeking help. Open your heart to receiving God’s love and grace through another person. Our Stephen Ministry offers the opportunity for a very confidential relationship with someone who will listen to you and provide you with care and encouragement, helping Christ to bring rest to your weary, burdened heart. Deadline for applications is March 31, 2023. Actual grant amount to each student is undetermined but will be based, in part, upon the number of students requesting assistance.
