

#### OFFERING UPDATE


Actual Offering Income for May:

#### **Meditation:**

"At that time the disciples came to Jesus, saying, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" And calling to Him a child, He put him in the midst of them and said, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 18:1-4)(ESV)

#### Giving a Cup of Cold Water

During Jesus' last three years on earth, He spent much time nourishing and teaching His disciples. Only when they were prepared to go out into the world to preach, teach, and heal did he send them. Leaving without provisions, the disciples were totally dependent upon those whom the Lord would send them for their support. The disciples relied upon the power of the Gospel to move the hearts of their listeners who would willingly provide for their needs. They were to travel light and trust in the Lord.

In Matthew 10:40-42 Jesus, referring to His disciples, said, "He who receives you receives Me, and he who receives Me receives the One who sent Me. Anyone who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and anyone who receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is My disciple, I tell you the truth, he will certainly not lose his reward." Jesus told His disciples that whoever gives to you is also giving to Him. Although support today doesn't fund the work of the 12 original disciples, we assist the spreading of the Gospel by supporting today's disciples and missionaries around the world. As we provide for church workers locally and abroad in the name of Jesus, we are serving the Lord Himself.

As we express our Christian faith through our giving and serving, God is pleased. God notices every act of compassion and kindness that we express. In the verse above, He refers to even the simple gesture of giving a cup of cold water to a thirsty person. Through our faith, we are empowered to do acts of service. When we act in response to the Lord and not for recognition, God will bless us. Having already been assured of salvation by God's grace through faith, blessings such as peace, contentment, patience, and hope are added rewards.

Only a small number of people make their living as full-time church workers, but we all are given the privilege and opportunity to be Christ's ambassadors. May God bless us all as we work to further His kingdom.

#### **Prayer:**

Dear Heavenly Father, certainly, in order to measure up to Your standards, I must ask You to increase my faith. Still I fail, for I do not love You with my entire being, nor do I love my neighbors as myself. I lack humility and I serve my own interests before those of others. Therefore, I thank You for the gift of Your Son Who has met Your standard of perfection and has lived that standard in my place. Forgive me, Lord, for my failures. Teach me to depend on You to give me grace to be obedient to Your command to love and to serve others even as You love me. Through Christ I pray. Amen.



I encourage you to join with us as we go out on our visits. Amazing things happen when we are serving our Lord and Savior! Please call Christy in the church office to check the schedule!







### Stephen Ministry: Discipline

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in Me that bears no fruit, while very branch that does bear fruit He prunes so that it will be even more fruitful."

John 15:1-2



Stephen Ministry at St. John's is a caring ministry that pairs a trained Stephen Minister with someone who is experiencing a difficult time of life. Recently, Pastor Mike spoke of God training his people, God's discipline, which sometimes occurs when we experience hardship, a crisis of faith, or opposition. We might ask, "If God is for me, why am I suffering?" Pastor Mike answered this by explaining that hard times may be a tool for our training within the context of our lives. We might have pain or difficulties which God allows for our personal and spiritual growth.

Stephen Ministers have gone through disciplined training which combines sound theological principles with contemporary psychology. The skills our Stephen Ministers learn and practice prepare them to provide a very high level of Christian caregiving. The training is intense as it explores some serious life issues and gives the opportunity for their own personal and spiritual growth.

The 50 hours of Stephen Ministry training is broken down into twenty  $2\frac{1}{2}$  - hour sessions that are held weekly. Among the training topics are:

- Feelings: Yours, Mine, and Ours
- ➤ The Art of Listening
- Distinctively Christian Caring
- > Assertiveness: Relating Gently and Firmly
- Maintaining Boundaries in Caregiving
- Confidentiality
- Ministering to Those Experiencing Grief
- Caring for People before, during, and after Hospitalization

If you, or someone you know, is suffering, feeling depressed, overwhelmed, or going through difficult times, please know that you don't have to go through a crisis alone. God carries you and your problems in His loving hands, and He provides hands-on help through Stephen Ministers. #### SO, WHAT'S NEW AT THE FARM?

There is an old farmers' saying that the corn should be "knee high by the 4<sup>th</sup> of July". Well, that might be more true for the Midwest than for us here in Northern California. Normally we can get into our fields sooner than they can. However, this year, because of late rains and cooler



weather thus far, our first planting of corn will just barely attain that height by that marker. We have often had it approaching head high and tasseling by the 4<sup>th</sup>. Not to worry. There will be plenty of corn.

The whole harvest from our Mission Farm is somewhat delayed. This matches a recent report in the local paper that the farmers who bring produce to the Farmers' Market have less produce to offer than normal at the point in time. Will this be the new normal with the much ballyhooed climate changes? We shall have to wait and see. Meanwhile we will shortly be in need of additional volunteer help when the ingathering of fruits and veggies picks up. Work days on the Farm are Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday mornings, 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

We have applied to participate again this year in CanDo's Give!Guide 2023 campaign, and assume we will again be selected. The campaign will begin the last week in November and run through December. Participation has been very helpful to get the word out to our community about the charitable mission of our Farm, as well as help generate supporting gifts for our operation.


