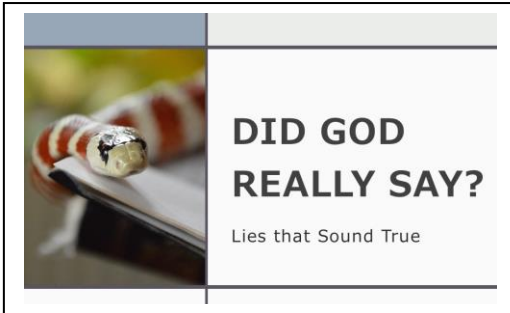

Maui Fire Relief

This update is from CNH District President Mike Lange:

Pray for the leaders and members of Emmanuel Lutheran, Kahului, Maui. They function as God's hands and feet to the people of Maui. They are Christ's ambassadors and bear the presence of the Savior. Pray for their strength and care as they walk beside many in great need, assisting them, and pointing them towards Hope, found only in Jesus.

What is happening?

- *The people of Emmanuel are providing immediate response, sharing needed goods and services, and assisting school families who are housing displaced people.*
- *Three staff members from Lutheran Church Charities, to include a crisis counselor, are deployed to Maui. They will help to organize a response effort able to be sustained by Emmanuel and supported by the CNH and the greater LCMS.*
- *Infusions of relief dollars from your CNH Disaster Fund, LCMS Disaster Relief, local congregations, individual donors, Orphan Grain Train, and LCEF are enabling a growing response.*
- *We hope to deploy more crisis counseling personnel to assist in ministering to survivors and caretakers, sponsored by LCMS Disaster Relief and the CNH.*

In addition, CNH District 1st VP, Rev Mitch Gowen, has been in conversation with the Governor and one of the State Representatives to see if it is possible to get a waiver on the animal quarantine Hawaii requires for animals coming into the state. If this happens, then it would open the possibility of LCC sending K9 comfort dog teams.

What can you do?

- Pray for those so horrifically affected, those mourning, and strength for caregivers.
- Encourage those you may know on Maui with texts, cards, and emails. Let them know you are remembering them and praying for them.
- Share a gift to support relief work and recovery. Here are several organizations involved in relief work:
 - LCMS Disaster Response
 - CNH District Disaster Relief Fund
 - Emmanuel Lutheran Church of Maui (indicate for disaster relief)
 - Lutheran Church Charities

SO, WHAT'S NEW AT THE FARM?

Often I am asked, “How many people are being touched with a bit of God’s grace by the produce the Mission Farm grows?” It’s a good question. But I find that I have to remind the questioner of an old saying: “Any fool can count how many seeds are in an apple. Only God knows how many apples are in a seed?” Think about it a moment.

So what does that have to do with the question that was addressed to me? Simple. I can tell you how many pounds of produce we turn over to the Food Bank to distribute to grocery-insecure families. The Food Bank can likely tell you how many people they serve (although some of our produce may end up in any of seven different locations). Only God knows, however, how many people are blessed as a result. We simply trust that many are, and that is sufficient for us. We simply love doing what we are doing (farming), and partnering with God to help feed the multitudes. It isn’t just a numbers game.

OK, so now you are going to ask how many pounds of produce have we contributed to the Food Bank so far this year. Less than last year, because the harvest is late. But we are catching up, now that we are sending in lots of melons together with the tomatoes and summer squash and jalapenos peppers. Shortly the corn will be coming in, and that will add a lot to the total as well. And the harvests are such at this time that our usual volunteers can scarcely keep up. So, yes, we can really use more hands!





Blessings to you as we begin our 2023-2024 school year with the theme "Live Love(d)!" based on Ephesian 5:1-2, *"Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."* With this theme, we are reminded that we're to walk in love just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us in His death upon the cross. 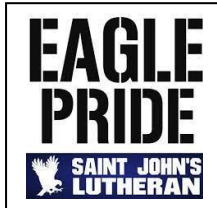

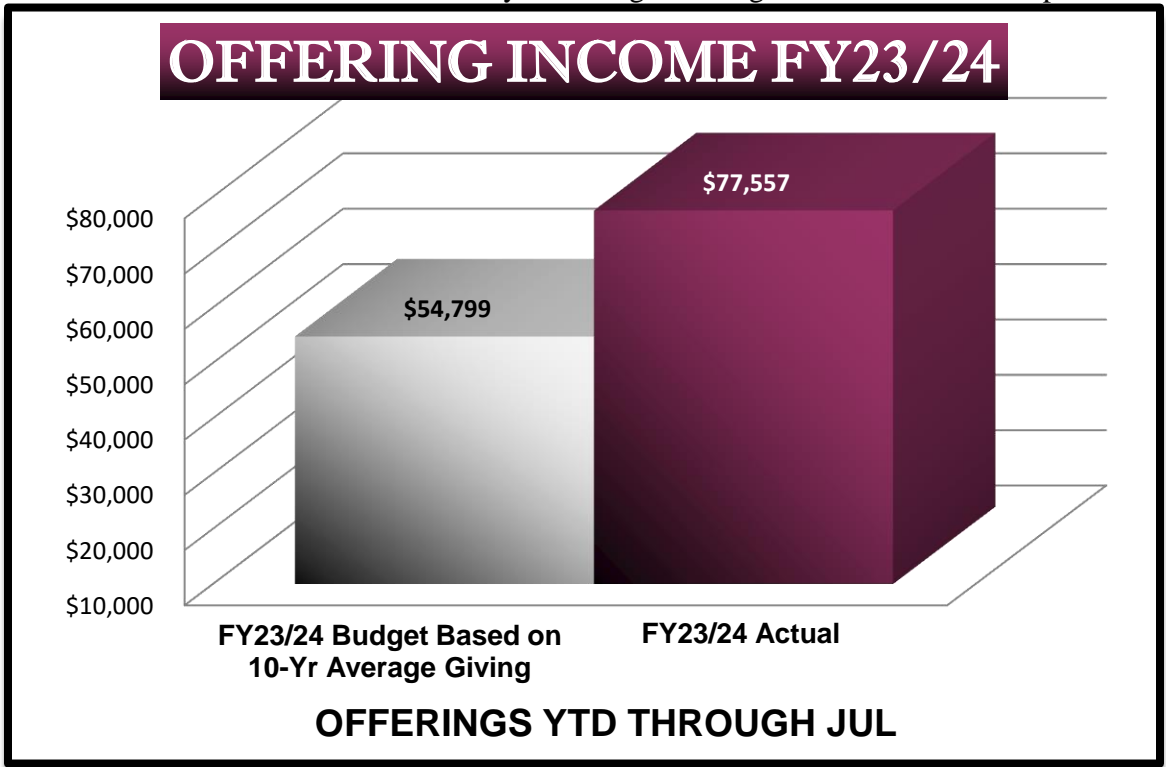
Actual Offering Income for Jul:

 (1 Corinthians 12:27)(ESV)

Working Together to Accomplish More

To build and edify His Church, God gives each believer at least one spiritual gift. In 1 Corinthians 12:4-6 Paul wrote, *“There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all men.”* We are limited in what we can do as individuals, but, working together, we can accomplish great things.

In verses 7-11 we read, *“Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. To one there is given through the Spirit the message of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of*

healing by that one Spirit, to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and He gives them to each one, just as He determines.”

In essence, we are one body made up of many parts. In his letter to the church in Corinth, Paul refers to the human body which is made up of many important parts. The eyes, ears, hands, legs, and arms work together, each performing its necessary role in the body. All are essential and necessary to form one body.

In an entirely different way of illustrating the importance of individuals working together to carry out the Lord’s work, we could consider how cranes are used at construction sites to lift tremendous loads with cables that are no bigger than garden hoses. The cable has so much strength because it is made up of individual strands. These strands are twisted together giving it incredible strength. In the same way, God gives His Church incredible ability because He binds us all together. Our individual spiritual gifts are combined with the gifts of others.

Discussion Questions:

1. What are spiritual gifts? (Romans 12)
2. Why does God give all believers spiritual gifts? (1 Corinthians 12)
3. What happens when God’s people work together?

Prayer:

Dear Heavenly Father, I thank You for giving me my abilities and my spiritual gifts. Grant me faith so that I will use all You have entrusted to me in ways that give You honor and glory. Help me to stand firm in my faith and help me to share Your love with others. In Your precious name I pray. Amen.

“Reliable friends who do what they say are like cool drinks in sweltering heat – refreshing!” Proverbs 25:13 MSG

“He leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul.” Psalm 23:2-3 NRSV

A friend recently told me about her experience of being listened to. She had been able to share some feelings that had been stuffed so deeply that she couldn't even find words to name them at first. She said it felt so refreshing to talk, almost non-stop for close to an hour, with a sympathetic person. It felt like a drink of cool water on a hot day.

Jesus was the model of a good listener. He demonstrated how much He really cared about people by listening. He broke cultural traditions by having a conversation with the Samaritan woman at the well. Other examples are Nicodemus who sought out Jesus, the blind beggars who called out to Jesus, and the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Jesus cared by first listening to people. We can always come to Jesus in prayer, and He listens. He wants to refresh our souls with cool water.

With the help of the Holy Spirit, we can live out God's love by being the body of Christ and listen to those in need. Listening is one of the most powerful ways that we care for each other. To be fully present, non-judgmental, patient, and focused, to ask for clarification and restate what has been said – all these validate the person who may be trying to work through complicated feelings.

We all want St. John's to be a caring place, where everyone truly feels cared for. Reach out to someone today and listen to how they're doing. 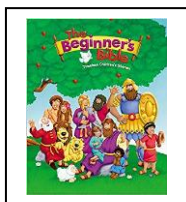

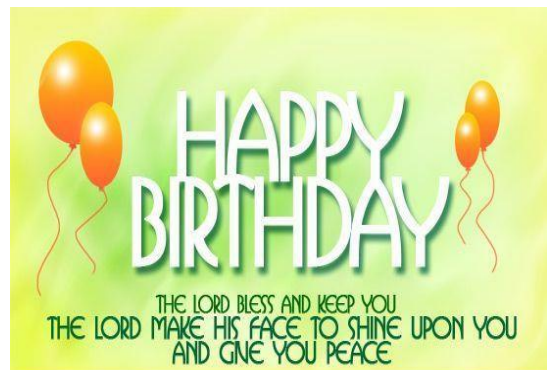

Did you know?



During one of their recent visits to a Ministry Production Center, an LBW representative heard an incredible story from one of their volunteers. With tears in his eyes, Jim stood up in front of the group and said, "Thank you for all the support over the past few weeks after my brother passed away. I do not think I could have survived this time without your love, prayers, and support." Later, during the coffee break, Jim shared his personal story even more with the LBW representative.

He and his brother were raised in the church, but he drifted away before he was baptized. He was involved in a lot of bad things and faced some difficulties in his personal life, and he was tired of feeling judged at the church. So, he renounced the church and left, staying away for decades. Even though he eventually got his life together, he never wanted to be part of a church again. Once his mother got older and more limited, he moved in with her. He would take her to her monthly Braille group meetings but wanted nothing to do with them. After she asked him a couple of times to help when they were short-handed, he worked side by side with the pastor of the church and not once did he feel judged or pressured by him.

He kept talking to the pastor working with the Braille group and eventually realized he needed to be back in church, he was baptized, eventually confirmed, and became a member of that Lutheran Church.

He was devastated when his mother, the one person who always had faith in him, passed away a few years later. The first person who arrived at his doorstep, aside from his brother, was the pastor, and next the volunteers from the Braille group. They helped him navigate that time of loss and again when his brother passed. He knows he will see his mother and brother again in heaven and he is glad Jesus loves him despite his history. There is no doubt in his mind that being with the Braille group saved his life. He has a love for the ministry and the chance to do this work. 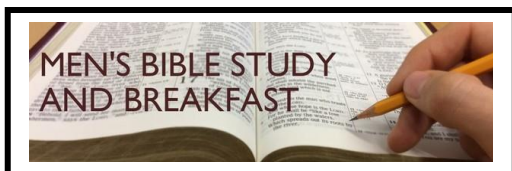
God works in different ways to reclaim his lambs. The Large Print and Braille ministries is just one of the many ways he works among us.
