Thankful Praying

We often think of prayers of thanksgiving having to do with giving thanks for prayers answered. But in Philippians 4:6, Paul encourages praying with thanksgiving as we present our requests to the Lord. *"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."*



What he is calling for is praying with thanksgiving before the prayer is answered. Our confidence in our Lord is such that we can give thanks before the prayer is answered. We can do this because, in Christ, we can have such confidence in the Lord's love. As Paul says in Romans 8:32, *"He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?"* Thanks be to God who gives us so much cause to be thankful!

Advent Midweek Services

During the season of Advent, we will also offer worship services on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM. Each of the services are unique with a different focus and style. Each service will also be preceded by a soup supper in the Parish Hall starting at 6:00 PM.

- **December 6 - The ABCs of Christmas:** We go through the alphabet looking at features of the story of the first Christmas.
- **December 13 - Lessons and Carols:** Led by the Sanctuary Choir. A service of Word and Song, tracing the prophecies of the Messiah through the announcement of His birth.
- **December 20 – The Hymns of Christmas** – The service will consist largely of singing favorite Christmas hymns, along with a brief devotion on each one about the hymn's background and message.

St. John's Lutheran Endowment Fund

- This past month we were blessed to hear from a representative of Linc Bay Area (<https://linc.org/bayarea/>). St. John's supports the ministry of Linc Bay area through a disbursement from our endowment fund. We will be highlighting a ministry or cause supported by our endowment fund each month.
- The purpose of St. John's Endowment Fund is to receive, manage, and distribute funds to support and implement the mission and vision of St. John's Lutheran Church and School. Key areas receiving financial support include Worship & Spiritual Growth, Scholarships, Mission Outreach, Capital Improvements, and Future Ministries.
- The Fund is overseen by a committee comprised of the Lead Pastor, Business Administrator, Treasurer, and appointed congregational members. The role of the committee is to accept, review, and recommend requests for disbursement. The committee is also responsible to promote the Endowment Fund by educating the congregation about the Fund, planned giving opportunities, and areas of charitable giving.

Young Eion and his dad joined us at the Mission Farm this past Saturday, and together they harvested several hundred pounds of **jalapenos** to be sent to the CANV Food Bank. From his face, you can tell that Eion was justifiably proud of his work and had fun doing it. As of the time this article was being composed (Oct 22nd)

nearly 17,000 lbs. have been harvested and sent in.



The harvesting of the summer crops is nearly at an end. But there are still many fall squashes to be harvested. Cool weather crops like broccoli, cabbages, radishes, and cauliflower have been planted. The other fields will be sown with cover crop to add nutrients to the soil for spring planting. So the work continues, interspersed with rain days when the volunteers will rest their bodies and seek their nourishment. You are welcome to join us any Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday morning (when

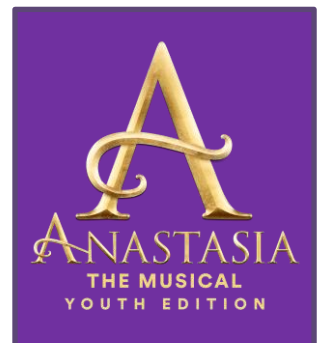

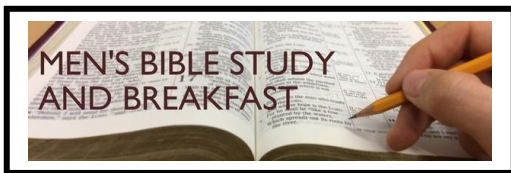

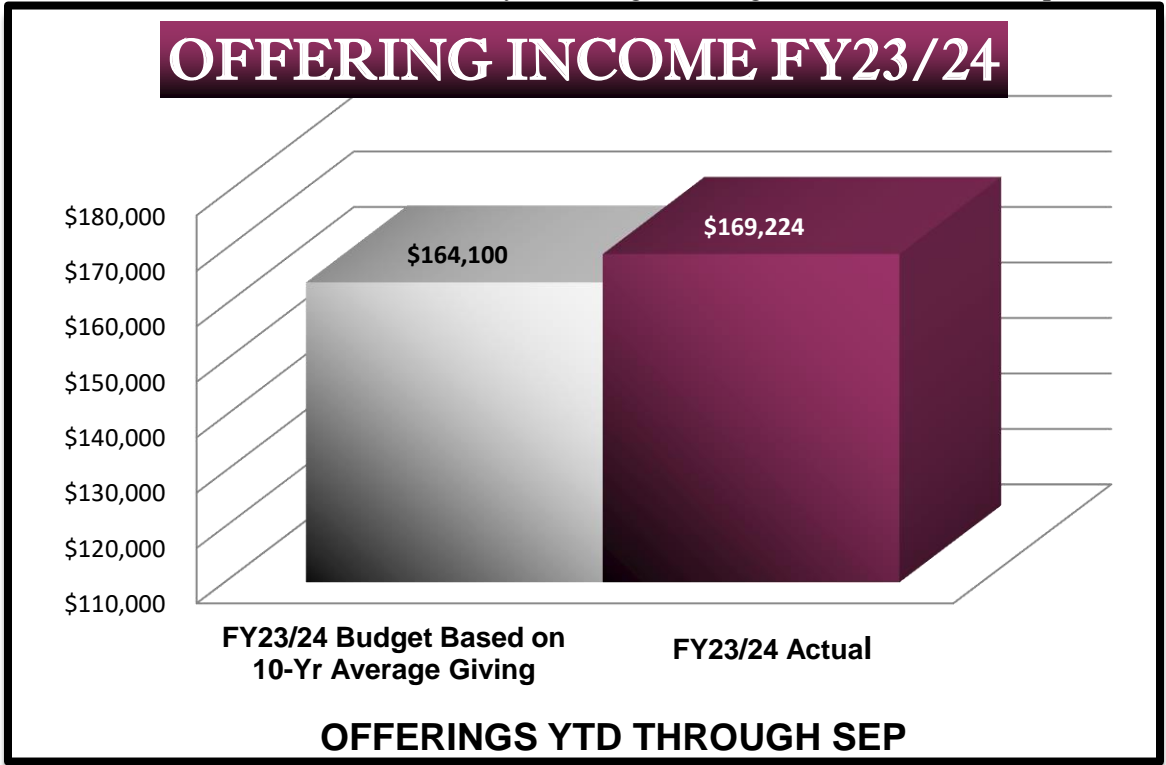
Actual Offering Income for Sep:

God’s Faithfulness

Throughout the Genesis account of the life of Joseph, one sentence keeps recurring: *“The Lord was with Joseph.”* Joseph enjoyed many times of success and happiness and endured years of being forgotten and unjustly punished. In all these circumstances, God was with him, and Joseph knew it.

Another Biblical character whose life consisted of ups and downs was David. One moment his brothers are making fun of him and the next he's their hero and everyone else's as he slays the giant Goliath. One minute he's King Saul's favorite servant and the next he's being hunted down by the same man. Like Joseph, David knew God was with him. In his psalms, David pours out his heart to God. He holds nothing back as he tells God he is set upon on all sides by his enemies and feels deserted by God, but he always ends on a note of faith, thanking God for His presence and His eventual deliverance.

God is faithful, even when we are not. His ways are so far above ours that we cannot comprehend them. We cannot imagine what He has in store for us, but we can be sure it is all for our good (Genesis 50:20).

Discussion Thoughts:

1. Have you ever been unjustly accused as both of these heroes of faith were? How? Did you give thanks for your ordeal?
2. Have you had opportunity to be a "Jonathan" to someone else enduring difficult times? (See 1 Samuel 20.)
3. Read 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 and act on it.

Prayer: O faithful God, You are the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. You are ever faithful. There is nothing in all of creation that can separate me from Your love in Christ Jesus. Help me to give You thanks in all circumstances and to remain faithful to You. Use me to encourage others to give thanks and to remain faithful as well. Through Christ I pray. Amen.

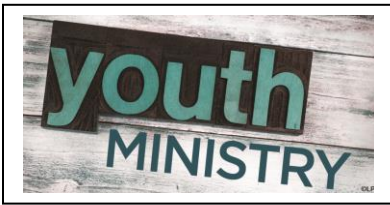
DISABILITY MINISTRY

Members of the Special Needs Bible Class were very excited to be included in the program for the Oktoberfest held at St. John's on October 14, 2023. They love to sing and sign their songs of praise to God during their Bible class gatherings on the 2nd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of each month. The Oktoberfest gave them the wonderful opportunity to be able to share their faith and love for the Lord with members of the congregation. They were encouraged by the people at the event joyfully singing along with them! The Oktoberfest planners had applied for and had received from *Thrivent* a service event grant supporting St. John's Disability Ministry work.



The newly formed Disability Ministry Task Force was recently informed of an opportunity to be involved with a ministry in the larger Napa community. For many decades, there has been a Christian fellowship organization supporting adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. They meet each month on the 4th Monday evening to share a dinner, their friendship, some songs, and a time of spiritual devotion and prayer. Our St. John's task force members and some friends provided the dinner, and led the singing and devotion for their gathering on October 23 at Napa Foursquare Church, the current host congregation for the group. What a joyful and inspiring fellowship group! The ministry is officially known as: ***Developmentally Disabled Christian Ministry*** or **DDCM**. The ministry is administered by a board of four officers and a couple of committee members. The average attendance at the fellowship gatherings is between 30-40 people. St. John's Task Force will continue to be supportive of this Christian disability ministry program.

Stephen Ministers: Compassionate, Full of Faith, Skilled and Trustworthy

Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. Ephesians 4:32



The word **compassionate** means “to suffer along with another person.” Compassionate Stephen Ministers are willing and able to share their care receivers’ feelings, and journey with them through their crisis. They are often “wounded healers” who have experienced loss or pain in life. They care deeply and personally about their care receivers. They want to bring Christ’s love and care so their care receivers can experience hope and healing.

Stephen Ministers are **full of faith** as they believe in Jesus and minister in His name. They trust God to provide the courage and love they need to care for their care receivers. Stephen Ministry is one way they express their faith in, and love for, Jesus. They pray for their care receivers. They believe that God can and will bring healing and wholeness, and they trust the Holy Spirit to actively draw the care receiver to Christ.

Stephen Ministers are **skilled** as they study and learn about feelings and challenges people are likely to experience when going through a crisis or difficult time. They know how to use essential caregiving skills such as listening, understanding and dealing with feelings, beginning and ending care relationships, maintaining boundaries, and helping their care receivers find more appropriate care when necessary. Stephen Ministers are aware that sometimes they must refer their care receiver to professional caregivers, such as pastors, counselors, or mental health professionals, to meet the care receiver’s need.

Stephen Ministers are **trustworthy** and reliable caregivers. They know the importance of their promises to their care receivers, and they fulfill those promises. They care for their care receivers for as long as support is needed. Even in challenging moments, they remain committed to their care receivers and the caring relationship. Stephen Ministers maintain confidentiality; they don’t tell others what goes on in their caring relationships, and in supervision meetings they are careful to avoid identifying their care receiver.

St. John’s is blessed to have 7 **compassionate, full of faith, skilled, and trustworthy** Stephen Ministers who are available to care for those in need. 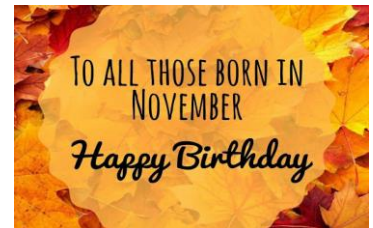
