Sunday Bible Classes

We have two Bible Classes on Sunday mornings after worship. Pastor Mike is leading "Foundations" in Room 10 (see below). Joel Wahlers is leading a study on the Gospel of Mark in Room 8. (see below)

The Gospel of Mark

The Gospel of Mark chronicles Jesus's journey from Galilee to Jerusalem. Along the way, the Messiah gathers a ragged band of disciples. As crowds grow and dwindle on the road to Jerusalem, only a few stick by the Suffering Savior on the road of discipleship.

In this 11 part class, Joel Wahlers will be making use of a Right Now Video course led by author and speaker Francis Chan. Tracing the steps of Jesus and the Twelve through Israel, Francis explores the major themes of the Gospel of Mark, and asks: Are we willing to take this journey to embrace discipleship?

Foundations: An Overview of the Christian Faith

What are the essential teachings of the Christian faith? What do they mean in our lives and in our world today?

Pastor Mike is leading a nine-session overview of the basic teachings of the Christian Faith. This study in basic Christianity will cover all the essential teachings, how they fit together into one compelling story, and what they mean for our lives today.

This class is required for those who are interested in membership at St. John's. But it is also helpful for those who seek to better understand the Christian story in order to grow in their faith and be better equipped to share it with others. Throughout the class we will be considering the major challenges to faith, and how the Christianity provides a better story for our world today.

Worship Tech Overhaul Faith Comes From Hearing

We've heard your feedback and understand that one of the biggest challenges you and our visitors face when attending worship in person or watching the livestream is participating in the service because it's difficult to see or hear God's Word, the lessons, and the beautiful music that's raised up to God in praise. SO, WHAT'S NEW AT THE FARM?



It pleases me to announce the results of our participation in the CanDo's 2023 Give! Guide campaign to raise money for the Mission Farm's next crop year.



We were able to raise \$4,100 in donations that came from 40 donors, 10 from the congregation and 30 from the community. You can do the math, but this means the average donation was over \$100! Add to this a total of \$9,960 donations that came in through the regular donation portals of the congregation during that same November-December period. That was an increase in the predictable donations that would have been received of \$7,194. So I believe it would be safe to say that the results of all the Give!Guide promotion encouraged member giving to the Mission Farm account through the normal donation portals as well. Adding the \$4,100 for Give!Guide to the total \$9,960 receipts in November and December (\$14,060) resulted in our ability to cover all the expenses incurred by the Mission Farm since July 1 (\$12,309)! By the grace of God we have demonstrated the ability to raise more than corn and squash and tomatoes in our fields, but can do so in a sustainable manner. Thank God for your generosity!

Speaking of raising corn and squash and tomatoes in our fields, by the grace of God we were able to turn over a total of 19,174 lbs. of fresh produce to the CANV Food Bank! It was a bit less than we have been able to do in the past several years. This was a challenging year, with rains coming, but not always at the right times. We lost most of the stone fruit this year. Other crops exceeded our expectations. Either way, food insecure families were provided for, and that is the main thing.

OFFERING UPDATE


Actual Offering Income for Dec:

Have a Heart

February: the month devoted to love. Stores are filled with heat-shaped boxes of candy and heart-shaped cards and vases of flowers with heart-shaped gift tags. All this is available for the consumer so that he can find the appropriate expression of his devotion to his loved one. If that expression of love has been preceded by a year of thoughtful and loving words and deeds, it is welcomed and cherished by the recipient. If not, it is just an empty ritual, done out of duty rather than true devotion.

Our relationship to the Lord is similar. He, too, desires our sincere devotion, not empty lip service. "The Lord says: 'These people come near to Me with their mouth and honor Me with their lips, but their hearts are far from Me' "(Isaiah 29:13).

Stewardship is serving, helping, giving, but love is the basis for stewardship. Without love, our good deeds are empty and without merit. The first act of true stewardship is to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:5). Jesus called this the most important commandment (Mark 12:29, 30). With that love for the Lord in us, we are enabled to be good stewards. Then we can do acts of good stewardship, acts of true devotion. We are enabled to . . .

- "Give generously to Him and do so without a grudging heart" (Deuteronomy 15:10).
- "Carefully observe [His decrees and laws] with all your heart and with all your soul" (Deuteronomy 26:16).
- "Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality" (Romans 12:13).
- "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men" (Colossians 3:23).

God, through Ezekiel, promised, "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put My Spirit in you and move you to follow My decrees and be careful to keep My laws" (Ezekiel 36:26-27). This promise He has fulfilled in His Son, Jesus, Who has followed His Father's decrees and kept His laws for us. As we strive to live fruitful lives of stewardship, at the same time, we rest in Christ Who has been the perfect steward for us.

- e) Year and Level of study (e.g. Junior year, Undergrad; 5th year, teacher certification, or student teaching; Graduate studies)
- f) Attending Fall Term or Spring Term (or both)
- g) Briefly explain why you're attending Concordia and how you plan to use your studies/future vocation to shine the light of Christ and to witness for Jesus as His kingdom representative in the world.

<u>Deadline for applications is March 31, 2023</u>. Actual grant amount to each student is undetermined but will be based, in part, upon the number of students requesting assistance. So, if you are considering attending a synodical university--<u>even if you have not made a final decision</u>--please send a brief note informing us of where you are in your decision process so that we can plan accordingly.
